WHAT WE HAVE LEARNED

- 1. Stormwater Run-off is the #1 pollutant of our bay
 - Painters Creek is the largest source of these pollutants
 - There is more we can do as residents to keep storm water on land and out of the bay
 - The high nutrient levels within pollutants lead to increased algae growth

2. The population of carp in the 3 neighboring bays is unhealthy.

According to experts, managing carp to healthy levels (less than 90 lbs/acre) can have the following benefits:

- Re-establishment of native vegetation
- Increased water clarity
- Healthier spawning and nursery habitat for game fish
