

Jim's Tech Tips
"Refueling With a Gas Can"

Sometimes I find it more convenient to go get 5 gallons of gas with a gas can for my Model A than it is to drive down to the gas station with the car to fuel it up.

But a 5-gallon can full of gas weighs over 30 pounds, and lifting it up to the gas cap on the Model A and controlling the can's spout as it enters the gas tank (without spilling gas all over the place!) can be a real challenge. Even with a helper to guide the spout into the tank as you go, it can be a mess.

My brother turned me on to this tip (thanks, Kevin!): For about \$20, you can purchase a small battery powered fuel transfer pump that will put the gas into your car in about a minute or two. This little thing is amazing!



You rest the gas can on the splash apron and fender (put a towel under it) and put the pump body into the gas can. Hold the pump outlet inside the gas tank filler opening with one hand and switch on the pump with the other hand. In no time at all the gas can is empty and you switch the pump off. Carefully remove the pump outlet from the tank and point it up to prevent fuel in the hose from dripping on your car. It's that easy, and a one-person operation.

On a car with side-mount spares, you can rest the gas can on the spare tire and hold it there, instead of resting on the splash apron and fender. It works just the same.

As an added bonus, you can quickly pump most of the old fuel OUT of a Model A gas tank with this pump, and into a 5-gallon gas can, if the need arises. I have done that, too.

Arthur "Art" F. Seifert

December 17, 1943 – September 6, 2025

Arthur "Art" F. Seifert, a man whose drive was matched only by his love of cars and family, took his final lap on September 6, 2025. He was 81.

Born in Battle Creek, Michigan, on December 17, 1943, Art was the youngest of four children in a preacher's family, where faith, community, and a strong work ethic shaped his life. His first business venture was a newspaper route, run with enough determination to buy a Zündapp Bella motor scooter. Decades later, as a COVID project, he restored a 1958 Bella scooter to near-perfect condition, bringing the story full circle.

At Lakeview High School, he was a natural leader, serving as class president both junior and senior year before joining the United States Air Force, where his skill and ingenuity led him to serve as Aide to the Air Force Chief of Staff.


Following his service, Art built a remarkable 32-year career with Hallmark Cards, retiring in 2002. His work in both domestic and international sales, retail merchandising, and brand management took him across borders and into boardrooms, always with the same focus on quality and creativity that defined Hallmark. Colleagues knew him as someone who approached business with sharp strategy and genuine warmth.

Cars remained a lifelong passion. For their 10th wedding anniversary, his wife, Jean, surprised him with a black 1939 Studebaker President, similar to the one he drove in high school. He delighted in sharing its history and cherished it as a symbol of craftsmanship, love, and partnership.

Though driven in his professional life, Art valued family and friends above all. He was a devoted husband to Jean for 59 years, proud father of three (Amy/Grant, Peter/Keri, and Rusty/Tricia), and doting grandfather of four (Carolyn, Libby, Ella, and Carter). He treasured time spent with family, and his legacy will live on through the values he instilled and the love he gave so freely. As Art (and Art's mom) would say, "Life is Good."

Art participated in a multiple myeloma clinical trial and was grateful for the excellent care he received from Dr. Abdallah and his team at the University of Kansas Cancer Center. We Are Losing A Trusted Supplier

Ken and Fran Coleman shared the following article.

I wanted to reach out to the community at large and share some sad news. After almost 50 years in the business Bratton's Antique Auto Parts has decided to close their retail operations.

There were multiple factors involved in making this decision and I will take some time below to outline them.

1) We have lost the lease on our building at 1606 Back Acre Circle. The current owners of the building received an unsolicited offer on the building that was too good to pass up. The new owner's take possession of the property at the end of October. Bratton has tried to extend the lease with the new owner's but they need the property for their own business. They have offered us an option to lease back the building until December 31, 2025. Debbie and I have been looking for a property to move the business to for several months, but we have not been able to find a suitable property.

2) Since the end of COVID, we have seen a substantial decline in revenue and a massive increase in overhead expenses (insurance, taxes, utilities...). Both of these situations caused us to let all of our reaming employees go back in July of 2024. Debbie and I have been doing everything here with just the two of us since then. We have decided that we need to rebalance our lives 50-60 hours over 5-6 days a week working just does not allow any time to go out and enjoy our lives. If anything, we have all learned since COVID is that life is too short and we need to make the best of everyday.

3) With the reduction in staff, it is all Debbie and I can do to just keep basic parts in stock, and process the orders. Debbie and I just cannot give our customer the quality of service that Bratton's has been known for since the mid 1970's, and that is not how we want the business to be run.

4) By closing our retail operations, it will allow us the time and energy to focus on making the high quality parts that we have always provided to the hobby. The parts that Bratton's has made will continue to be made through a new company and will only be sold through our network of dealer's.

We have spent the past couple of months quietly shopping Bratton's around to various buyers who we felt had the capital needed to continue the production of the parts. Unfortunately, we have been unable to reach a suitable agreement with any potential buyers. We did this quietly because we did not want to cause any undue stress or panic to the hobby, or the other vendors selling Model A parts.

Going forward we will begin the liquidation process for the retail inventory. Starting in the next couple of days and weeks you will notice the following things.

1) As we sell out of parts we will no longer be re-ordering them, so what is on the shelf is what is on the shelf, and when the bin box is empty, it is empty.

2) We will begin to reduce the prices on our retail inventory. These reductions will be shown our website and we will be offering across the board discounts on the prices listed on the website.

3) We ask that if you have a gift certificate stashed away that they be used by the end of October 2025. After that, they will no longer be valid.

4) We have removed all drop ship items from our website and catalog. This was done out of respect for our vendors. We do not want to cause any additional burden or stress on them, but offering their products at a much lower price than they are selling them at.

This decision has been months in the making, Debbie, and I feel it is the best for us as well as the hobby in general. Between the two of us, we have been in the business for over 55 years collectively. In those years, we have made many friends that we now consider as family. Debbie and I have many fond memories of our children running around the shop, and the journey's we took all over the country in our Model A. This business and the hobby in general has given us way more than we ever expected or deserved. We have been truly blessed by our time in the business. We offer our sincere thanks and gratitude to our customers and friends for the past 50 years of support.




