

The following is the reprint of a story submitted by Bob Craig, a former member of the Plain Ol' A's. This story was originally printed in the June, 2005 issue of The Plain Dealer.

#### Model A's and Me

My first car was a Model T for which I paid \$13.00. This had been a very nice original car when the previous owner bought it, but, unfortunately, he caught the top on the barn door and in an unwise action he cut the body off just behind the cowl and made a wooden platform to cover the rest of the chassis. Needless to say, the body I paid .75 cents for at the town dump was not nearly as good. That car lasted about a year before it threw part of a main bearing bolt through the side of the pan. That was the end of that Model T for me.

My next car was a 1930 Model A coupe (\$70.00). I drove it about a year before finishing college and moving to Ft. Worth, with it, to take a job there. That was of course a real improvement over the T and it made many trips between Ft. Worth and Denton (also known as Little D). It came to grief in Dallas (Big D) when it tied at an intersection with a fire department official who was apparently racing home for supper (no lights or siren).

I acquired a 1935 Chevy in 1971 and after some ten years decided I had had it long enough and told Jim Shanks I wanted to put it in his auction when he left Union Station. He suggested I bring the car down to his museum right away, which I did. We discussed my reserve price and much to my surprise he told me to bring the title down the next day!

I told Jim I sort of would like a Model A but had waited too long 'til prices got away from me. He said maybe not and proceeded to sell me a 1931 roadster from his floor. After another ten years or so and many trips to Colorado and other surrounding states, Vivian informed me that she had had her hair blown (and been soaked) enough and we should have windows if I wanted her to continue touring with me.

I set my sights on a Victoria since they are sort of out of the ordinary (of course I have wished many times I had gotten a slant windshield Fordor which were not all that hard to come by then). Anyhow, I found ads for two Vickies, one in Pennsylvania and the other in North Carolina. Since we were going east for Christmas, I got to see both of them and chose the one in Carolina. This car has certainly served us well, some 33,000 miles in the past thirteen years, with the most serious road trouble being a broken fan belt which I replaced at the next little town.

With the fun and luck I have had with Model A's, it is easy to see why they are called "America's Sweetheart." I still have a soft spot for Model T's, though.




