Dog Days End

The phrase "Dog Days" refers to the hottest days of summer. The Old Farmer's Almanac lists the traditional timing of the Dog Days: the 40 days beginning July 3 and ending August 11, coinciding with the heliacal (at sunrise) rising of the Dog Star, Sirius. The rising of Sirius does not actually affect the weather (some of our hottest and most humid days occur after August 11), but for the ancient Egyptians, Sirius appeared just before the season of the Nile's flooding so they used the star as a "watchdog" for that event. Since its rising also coincided with a time of extreme heat, the connection with hot, sultry weather was made for all time

The following is reprinted from the Central Iowa Model A Club Newsletter who borrowed it from the San Luis Obispo A's who borrowed it from the Palomar A's who borrowed it from the Harbor A's.

THAT PERFECT "AH-000-GA" It is necessary that the armature rotate at a high rate of speed. This speed is possible only when the bearings are properly oiled and the commutator and brushes are clean. Once a month, remove the motor cover located at the rear of the horn. Place a few drops of oil on each end of the motor shaft. Use a light oil and do not apply too much.

To clean the commutator, set the motor in motion by pressing the horn button. While the motor is revolving, hold a piece of fine sand-paper against the commutator until it is clean. Next with a small piece of wood, clean the gaps between the commutator segments. Do not use metal to clean gaps. When turned with fingers, the armature should revolve freely.

If the horn doesn't operate, check:

- Battery charge, wiring for good connections and horn button for contact.
- Ratchet wheel for wear or too much grease.
- Diaphragm for rust and wear on center post. Be sure there is one paper thin gasket on each side.
- See that all bolts are properly tightened. The cover hold down screw should be only 7/8ths inch long. Over tightening this screw can cause a direct short.

The following is an article published in the May 1992 issue of The Plain Dealer by Bob Craig, a long time member of The Plain Ol's A's.

MY MODEL A'S

by Bob Craig

I got my first Model A ... a 1930 Coupe ... in 1941 while still in college. About a year later I went to work for the U.S. Weather Bureau in Ft. Worth, Texas. That next year the Model A served me well ... many weekend trips home to Denton (35 miles, northeast) as well as to work and also to school at TCU for part of that summer.

That Model A came to grief in March 1943 when I tied at an intersection in Dallas with a fire chief who was probably late going home to dinner. At any rate he wasn't exhibiting emergency signals, just driving fast. I sure wanted to collect damages, but we don't "fight city hall" and win. Incidentally, when I went to Ft. Worth to work, my dad made me buy liability insurance ... \$17 per year! The insurance company told me to settle, for each party to fix his own car, after I got a letter from the city claiming that they couldn't be sued. I sold the car for \$35.

I have been interested in old cars at least since World War II, and maybe before, especially Model T Fords. In 1971 I finally realized that I had better get started if I was ever going to "get into old cars". My first venture was a nice original 1935 Chevrolet Master Deluxe Sport Sedan that I paid \$675 for. We drove that car many miles with the Horseless Carriage and Vintage Chevrolet clubs, the longest trips being to Colorado Springs and to Lake Itasca, Minnesota. The trip up Pikes Peak in this Chevy was much more difficult than in the Model A, 15 years later. It boiled all the way and almost gave up on the last switchback!

In the fall of 1983 when Jim Shanks was closing his museum at Union Station, I decided the Chevy's wood body was getting pretty creaky and it might be time for a change. I took it down to put in Jim's auction a couple of weeks early, with what I thought was a hefty reserve. Jim asked if I wanted to wait for the auction or should he sell it if he could. The next day he called and told me it was sold and to bring the title down! He still made me pay a whole month's rent for one day of storage!

While making idle chitchat, I mentioned to Shanks that I wouldn't mind having a '30 or '31 Model A Roadster, but I had watched them price themselves out of my range. Being the consummate salesperson that he is, he had me tour the museum with him and sure enough there was a black (I thought) drap-looking roadster that needed some detailing.

After a couple of days of soul-searching, dickering, and pleading with Vivian, I drove the roadster home. In sunlight we discovered that it was very dark brown instead of black and after having it striped and the wheels painted it didn't look as stodgy as I first thought.

That year (1983) the Metro Antique Auto Club and the Early V-8 Club had their Christmas parties together since both clubs needed help to fill a hall. Late arrivals at the party who sat across the table from us introduced themselves ... Bob and Joyce Swigert! He wasted no time getting me over to see his cars the next day and signing me up in the fledgling Plain Ol' A's and MAFCA.


Vivian and I made many trips in the Model A Roadster, seemingly usually in the rain: Lake Geneva with the Swigert's in 1985, Colorado Springs with a group of enthusiasts in 1991, and two one-week tours of Colorado and New Mexico after towing the Model A out there.

never knew that there were as many things that could go wrong with a car as did during my eight years with that Model A, but apparently they all got fixed, or at least enough of them, and usually by me. There was only once that we didn't get home under our own power. A front wheel bearing froze and we had to be towed from Cameron, MO., my own fault, of course.

For several years we have been looking for a Model A Victoria (affordable) and finally we found one last December. 


