#### Chewy Chocolate Chip Cookies

- 2 cups + 2 Tbsp all-purpose flour
- 1/2 tsp baking soda
- 1/2 tsp kosher salt
- 1-1/2 sticks (12 Tbsp) unsalted butter, melted & cooled until warm
- 1 cup light brown sugar
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1 large egg + 1 egg yolk
- 2 tsp vanilla
- 1 to 1-1/2 cups semisweet chocolate chips
- 1-1/2 cups sweetened dried coconut
- 1 cup toasted sliced almonds
- 1. Whisk flour, baking soda and salt together; set aside.
- 2. Mix butter & sugars thoroughly. Add eggs and vanilla and beat until just combined.
- 3. Add dry ingredients and beat on low speed until just combined.
- 4. Stir in chips, coconut and almonds.
- Roll scant 1/4 cup dough into ball. Break into two pieces; rotate 90 degrees and with jagged edges up form ball again. Leave 2 1/2" between each cookie dough ball.

Bake 15-18 minutes at 325 degrees on parchment paper. Cool on baking sheets. 046784.WPD

It was driven by a chain, and the transmission had only two gears - first for 10 MPH, and second for 20 MPH. It did not have a reverse gear.


