Model A Regional Meets

We have been in the Model A hobby for over twenty years, and we still get excited when June rolls around. Every June there is a Model A Regional Meet held somewhere in the Midwest area. As we were filling out our registration form for this year's regional in Colorado Springs, we got to reminiscing about other regionals we've attended.

We bought our first Model A ('29 Roadster) in 1982 in Norton, Kansas. Going to Norton and picking up the roadster is another story in itself, but we won't get into that right now.

Shortly after getting our roadster, our friends, Dave and Sue Ryan, talked us into going to Omaha for our first of many regional meets. We were reluctant to try and drive our new Model A all the way to Omaha but Dave kept telling us that the roadster would make it, so we packed it up and off we went. We met Dave and Sue early in the morning and drove to Platte City where we met up with Bob and Joyce Swigert. Dave was right all along, our roadster made it with flying colors. After experiencing our first regional meet, we were hooked.

We have attended regionals where it rained most of the week, or when the temperature stayed in the 100's all week. The different types of weather conditions we've encountered have never kept us from having a good time, though. We have met some of the best people in the world (Model A'ers) while attending regional meets. We have formed some long lasting friendships with not only the folks we've traveled with, but with folks from other clubs too. We have seen families grow up, and we have lost a few good friends along the way.

As our family grew, the need for a bigger car became apparent (no room in a roadster for us, two kids, grandma, and luggage), so the hunt began for a four door sedan. We bought our four door from a guy in Omaha (another good story), and restored it in 1988-1989.

Museums, lakes, parks, state capitols, train trips, boat trips, and seminars (men's and women's) are just some of the activities we've done while attending regionals. All of these adventures always include lots of eating and conclude with a banquet on the last night.

Part of the fun of regionals is "kicking tires" in the parking lot of the hotels in the evening. There is always someone's Model A to stick your head under the hood of. Open the hood on a Model A and you are guaranteed to draw a crowd.


One of the most memorable regionals we've have ever attended was the Colorado Springs trip in 1993. The highlight of this trip was the drive to the top of Pike's Peak. We thought this would take all day, but to our surprise, it took only about four and a half hours round trip from the hotel. The Colorado folks had a "How to drive Pike's Peak" seminar the night before our trip up the mountain. They told us that on the trip down the mountain if you used your brakes more than 10 times you were doing it wrong. Our kids started counting, and we used ours only 7 or 8 times, so we guessed we did it right.


In all the years we've been attending regional meets, our groups have only had one car that did not return home under its own power. We've had some breakdowns along the way, but we've always made it safe and sound.

If you have never been to a regional meet, plan on attending one. If you haven't been to one in several years, "Relive the Journey".


It's time to wake up our Model A's and get them ready to start touring.




