

O-Ring to Protect Upholstery

I GOT THIS SIMPLE IDEA from a friend of mine - Bobby Roy, who lives in Ola, Arkansas.


Behind a finish washer for upholstery, use a #78 O-ring under the washer as a backup to keep from cutting into the material. I have put this idea to use with good results.

Start with a classic X-style lug nut wrench. If you don't already

Place the wheel/tire next to the vehicle, leaning it against the hub and brake drum you plan to mount it on. Adjust the jack so that the wheel needs to be lifted an inch or two onto the studs,

have one, mine is 20" across and works quite well.



Hold the wheel in against the drum while you lower the lug wrench and use that free hand to start a lug nut on one of the studs. Once you have that lug nut started, you can let go of the wheel and start the rest of them. Use the tire iron to run them all in snug, then lower the jack and tighten them all again.


This Tip is not just applicable to mounting a wheel/tire on a Model A. It works on pretty much any vehicle: car, truck, trailer... In fact, the larger and heavier the wheel/tire is that you are putting on, the bigger help this is.

So in the shop or out on the road, use a simple tire iron to help you lift a wheel up into place and hold it there while you start the lug nuts.

ALL FIRED UP By Bob and Mary Lobner

Mary and I were invited by my brother Don to go to the 1990 Omaha Regional Model A car show. Don was in the process of restoring his 1931 Model A Fordor sedan, so we made the trip in our Aerostar Ford Van. We enjoyed the cars so much that we decided we wanted our own Model A. We decided on a 1929 Model A Sport Coupe belonging to Dean Weller.

Dean completed restoring the car July, 1983. I received a log from Dean that covered the maintenance, parts and accessories, car shows and parades attended from July 1983 to September 1990 when we purchased the car. Dean won several trophies at various car shows.

We purchased the car from Dean on September 6, 1990 and won second place at the Olathe Car Show on September 7, 1990. September 25, 1990 we joined the Plain Ol' A's. The Desoto Days 1990 Car Show was next ... we won First Place. At the Lathrop Antique Car and Tractor Show we won Second Place. With several other club members we traveled to the Pikes Peak Classic. We traveled 1,000 miles by way of Nebraska and Wyoming. We won Third Place at the regional show.


A week after the Pikes Peak Classic all of our good luck went out the window. On my way home from my brother Don's house my car caught fire. I got out of my car to check the water in the radiator. While I was filling the radiator I noticed smoke coming from the engine compartment. I raised the hood and saw that the engine was on fire. The paper air filter located next to the exhaust pipe had become saturated with gas which caught fire, melting the in-line plastic fuel filter.

When the car was restored the air cleaner was replaced with a K&N Hi-Flow Air Cleaner. The air cleaner is advertised by E.S.C. Industries in the *Restorer* magazine. The air cleaner was mounted above the exhaust pipe. The fuel filter was replaced with a metal filter.

With the help of my brother Don and his son Mike, the car was restored in nine months. The chassis had to be removed from the frame, so the car was completely dismantled and reassembled. All of the parts that were not original equipment were replaced. The car was painted Niagara Blue and Duchess Blue with Straw Yellow wheels.

Don completely rebuilt the engine. The crankshaft and other moving parts were balanced. New pistons, rods, valves, water pump, and components were installed. With the new metal valve stems, windshield wiper, carburetor, shocks and shackles, top and tires, the car was ready for the MAFCA National Convention in Dallas.

In June, 1992, we traveled with five other members to the MAFCA National Convention in Dallas. Our



1929 Sport Coupe won Second Place in the Touring Class. In the 1992 Lenexa Parade, a corvette took first place, we came in second with our 1929 Model A.

Since we have purchased the car it has been a real joy for Mary and me. We have met many new friends and acquaintances through the Plain Ol' A's and have traveled to many new and interesting places.

My interest in "old cars" goes back to when I was a teenager in the 1960's. I had always been fascinated by the old cars, and I liked the way they looked ... their lines were more interesting than the then-current models. I enjoyed the old silent Laurel & Hardy movies (some of which I collected over the years), and as you know Laurel & Hardy and their buddies were hard on cars, and one or more cars would be destroyed in a typical movie. Also, my grandfather probably passed on some "Ford blood" since he'd sold Fords, including the T's and A's before retiring and selling his Ford dealership in 1956.

As a 16 year old with time on my hands (but no money!) my best friend and I would scour the want ads for old Fords, and often go look at what was for sale. I also remember wandering around the old car "graveyard" behind Rick's. With no money, we would only dream of owning and driving an A.

When I graduated from law school and started earning a living, I felt I had "disposable income" which would allow me to pursue my interest. I bought a 1926 Model T Roadster and had a lot of fun tinkering with it. (I converted it back to six volts, among other things.) Unfortunately, the T couldn't get around the block without overheating and the engine dying and refusing to restart, so it generally sat in storage. All I had were frustrations.

Around four years ago, I met Harold Windsor, from Richmond, Missouri, after a parade in which he drove a Model A he had restored. I told him about my T problems, and eventually I had him come to Kansas City and haul the T back to his shop for evaluation and possible repair.

Harold, quite the salesman, convinced me I should "swap" the T (plus some money) for a car he had just finished restoring. After some talking, thinking and negotiation, I had purchased a "modern" car ... a 1930 Tudor. I understand this was the last A he restored, since Harold died several months later.

The Tudor proved to be reliable (something my T never would be) and my wife even liked it! The first day I had it, my then four-year old sat in the back seat as I drove, too fast, around Meyer Circle, and he went from one side of the car to the other. My wife said "no more rides for him until you get seat belts," which I now have. I have enjoyed working on my car, although I have been reluctant to tackle some projects for fear of less than satisfactory results (like removing and repairing a leaky gas tank.)

Joining the Plain Ol' A's was certainly a great move on my part. The people are all friendly, the tours interesting, and there's <u>always</u> someone willing to lend a hand, a tool, or give some free advice. I couldn't be happier with my A or my club, and look forward to many years of both!


