





Thursday, June 2 - Registration will be open from 10am – 5pm on Thursday. We'll kick off our Regional with a German fest Welcome Party in the evening.

Friday, June 3 - In the morning, you'll head to The Johnson County Museum featuring exhibits that include the "House of the Future", a 1950's all electric house, with futuristic gadgetry such as a hidden TV, electric curtain opener, garage opener and many other items. After the Johnson County Museum, you'll then drive to the living history museum at the Mahaffie House, a stagecoach stop on the Santa Fe Trail. You'll be able to ride on the stagecoach, watch a blacksmith work and see a working frontier kitchen. Also visit their museum featuring the history of the Santa Fe Trail and Bleeding Kansas. The price for the day includes a catered lunch at Mahaffie House.

Saturday, June 4 - We'll take a bus tour to the National World War I Museum in Kansas City, MO. Price includes bus transportation and admission to WWI Museum. This world class museum features artifacts and exhibits of life of a WWI soldier in combat. After the WWI Museum, you'll re-board the buses for a short trip through downtown to the City Market Area for lunch on your own. 
