My dear sisters and brothers in Christ Jesus,

We have begun the sacred seasons of Lent and Easter, a 90 day journey through the Paschal Mystery of the death and resurrection of Jesus that culminates in the great feast of Pentecost, the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. The first forty days



are the Lenten journey with Jesus from his baptism to his passion, death, and burial. Then the fifty days that follow, take us from his resurrection and ascension to Pentecost.

We prepare our own journey with Jesus through the first six weeks by more intense prayer, focused fasting, and almsgiving in order to let go of self and think and act for others. First, we focus on God by prayer and worship, then we focus on others by our fasting and sharing of our time, talent, and treasure with those in need.

These three disciplines are not the ends of Lent in themselves, rather they are means to an end.

The end and focus of Lent is Baptism, both of the catechumens and candidates at the Easter Vigil and our own renewal of our baptismal promises. Lent began in the Church as a way for the whole People of God to join the elect (those who are preparing to enter the Church at the Easter Vigil) during their final six weeks of preparation, a kind of retreat for them. Inspired by the zeal of these folks, we are called and challenged to use the time of Lent to get our hearts ready to renew our own Baptismal promises at Easter.

In our baptism, the Lord Jesus offered us authentic joy, meaning, and purpose to our life, inner freedom and peace, love without end, and a share in his own divine life, all that our hearts desire and long for. We start out with so much going for us, yet all too soon we

get caught up in the snares and enticements of the evil one, just like Adam and Eve did. Therefore we need to renew our promises and resolve.

One of the important observances during Holy Week is the Chrism Mass. There, our Bishop blesses the Oil of Catechumens, the Oil of the Sick, and the Sacred Chrism. In a dramatic way the Bishop consecrates the Chrism Oil, adding the balsam oil (a perfume substance) to the olive oil, and then breathing on this mixture he and the priests who are present, pray for the Holy Spirit's presence and power over the Chrism Oil. It is consecrated as the bread and wine are at Mass.

The word "chrism" comes from the same root word as does the word "Christ" the anointed one.

We are anointed with this sacred, consecrated oil to share in the priesthood of Jesus Christ, in his ministry of prophetic word based on the Scriptures, and as kings, and queens, not lording it over but as servants leading others to the Lord. To be anointed means we are sealed by the Holy Spirit and literally become sons and daughter of God.

I read with interest Joe Difato's reflections on Baptism and anointing with oil in the Lenten Issue of the *Word Among Us*. He writes about St Paul's comments in 2 Corinthians, "The one who ...anointed us is God, He has also put His seal upon us and given us the Spirit in our hearts as a first installment." (2 Corinthians 1;21-22.) We receive the same Holy Spirit that Jesus received at His baptism in the Jordan River... Jesus was baptized by John and as soon as He came out of the water, the Holy Spirit descended upon Him in the form like a dove. When He later began His public ministry, Jesus

announced, "The Spirit of the Lord is upon Me, because He has anointed Me..." (Luke 4:18).

Jesus was not to be the only one anointed by the Spirit, so He made it possible for us too to be filled with

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the Spirit when we are baptized and given a share in the grace and power and the seal of authority. Joe's reflections continue on what the anointing does for us:

- We are anointed to **KNOW**God personally —as St Paul wrote to the Ephesians, "Paul prayed that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation resulting in a knowledge of Him." (1:17)
- We are anointed to DISCERN
 God's will, that is, to distinguish
 between good spirits and evil

ones, between truth and falsehood. We need this gift in order to be transformed by the renewing of our minds.

And we are anointed to SERVE, to continue
 Jesus' ministry of bringing the good news, freeing
 the oppressed, healing the sick etc. One of the
 surest signs of the presence of the Holy Spirit is
 the desire to serve and care for people.

We have been anointed and sealed with the Holy Spirit at our Baptism and in Confirmation, but it needs to be actualized by our personal YES, that is our personal response of faith to the divine grace. Jesus has anointed us with His Holy Spirit and longs for us to say yes to Him. Let us pray: Come Holy Spirit and unbind these wonderful sacraments in our lives so that we can know you better. Come Holy Spirit and fill our hearts and fill the hearts of all the faithful.
