Change doesn't come easily. For most of us, giving things up doesn't come easily either, especially when we have (or think we have) a lot of good stuff worth holding onto. After all, we are "Adam," people of the earth, and change requires loss before gain. "Put to death, therefore, whatever in you is earthly," writes Saint Paul. Interesting that it's not necessarily something that happens to us, it's something we do to ourselves. So why would we intentionally put something inside of us to death?

Saul of Tarsus had many religious & social advantages. He was born to the right people "a member of the people of Israel...a Hebrew born of Hebrews." He was also a Roman citizen, with all of its privileges. He had the right religious ceremony of initiation, "circumcised on the eighth day." He had the right religious education and religious standing in society, "a Pharisee." He even opposed the right people (so he thought), "a persecutor of the Church." If anyone was on the right path, it was him, "as to righteousness under the law, blameless."

Still with all of these advantages, he writes: "Yet whatever gains I had, these I have come to regard as loss because of Christ. More than that, I regard everything as loss because of the surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord" (Phil.3:7-8a).

Some of you are starting **New Leaven**. Most of you are hearing about this for the first time, so let me explain. New Leaven is a discipleship program made for people baptized in the Holy Spirit. It entails a small group sharing food, having a time for worship, a teaching, and a time to share, but it's all in service to foster a change the Lord is calling us to, and then to actually start doing it. It may be small or big, but after prayer and discernment and the encouragement of the group, we do it. We don't just talk about it. Jesus says as much as he finished His Sermon on the Mount..." Everyone therefore who hears these words

Mt.7:24 And Saint James confirms this in his letter, "But be doers of the word, and not merely hearers who deceive themselves. For if any are hearers of the word and not doers, they are like those who look at themselves in a mirror; on going away immedi

for they look at themselves and, on going away, immediately forget what they were like." James 1:22-24

Let us all make the changes He wants, so we can say with Saint Paul: "For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things, and I regard them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but one that comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God based on faith. I want to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and the sharing of his sufferings by becoming like him in his death, if somehow I may attain the resurrection from the dead." Phil 3:7-11

New Leaven is a great tool to use to help discern and make changes that bring us closer to the Lord, but whatever inspires you to change, do it. Whatever He wants you to give up or add or do differently will be worth it, for as we respond to His Word, we begin to touch Him, to hold Him, to live the life that is truly life. Beloved MCCR, we are called to be His men and women, His saints, His body. Let us continue to pursue the surpassing greatness of knowing Christ Jesus...so that somehow we may attain the resurrection from the dead!
