Recently, I was sitting on my patio in Ft. Myers Florida listening to my favorite bird, the mockingbird, sing his many different songs. The mocking bird is unique


in that he mimics the calls of dozens of other bird types.

March is also the month of St Joseph as we celebrate his feast day on March 19. Many here in Marblehead, are praying the "Consecration to St Joseph" by using the book by the same name written by Fr Donald H. Calloway, MIC. Each day we pray, read and reflect on a different aspect of St Joseph's life. There is a small group that meet in church on Tuesday morning, while there are quite a few participating through our Zoom, while others are praying the Consecration as couples or individually in their own homes.

The 33 days opened on February 15th and will conclude on March 19, the Feast day of St Joseph. For us that is our Lenten project. But we will offer the 33 days again, perhaps in the summer and again in the fall. The Year of St Joseph goes on until December 8.

The notion of a thirty-three day prayer period before the day of consecration is based upon the same type of program developed for Consecration to Mary, which high lights her gifts and attributes, first developed by St Louis de Montfort. So, the same for St Joseph, his gifts and attributes are also given as reflections,

In his introduction to the book, Fr. Donald H. Calloway, makes the case that now is the time for such a year of dedication to the foster father of Jesus and the spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. He offers a list of remarkable events that have occurred over the past 150 years showing the increase of importance of St Joseph in the life of the Church.

Fr Calloway also gives two reasons why this is the time of importance for such an observance.

- First, we need the spiritual fatherhood of St Joseph to help us protect marriage and the family in our day and age.
- Second, the entire world needs to be re-evangelized, including the vast majority of baptized Catholics and Christians. In an Apostolic Exhortation on St Joseph in 1989, Pope John Paul II reminded us of the necessity of invoking St Joseph in the work of re-evangelization the world. The Pope wrote: "The patronage [of St Joseph] must be invoked as ever necessary for the Church not only as a defense against all dangers, but also, and indeed primarily, as an impetus for her renewed commitment to evangelization in those lands and nations where religion and the Christian life were formerly flourishing and are now put to a hard test."

I would like to share a couple of prayers directed to St Joseph that have been offered down through the years. Many of them are parallels to the Marian prayers and may sound a bit familiar.

THE MEMORARE TO St Joseph

Remember, O most Chaste Spouse of the Virgin Mary, that never was it known that anyone who fled to thy protection, implored your help, or sought your intercession was left unaided. Inspired by this confidence, I fly uno you, my spiritual father, and beg your protection, O Foster Father of the Redeemer, despise not my petitions, but in your goodness hear and answer me. Amen.




