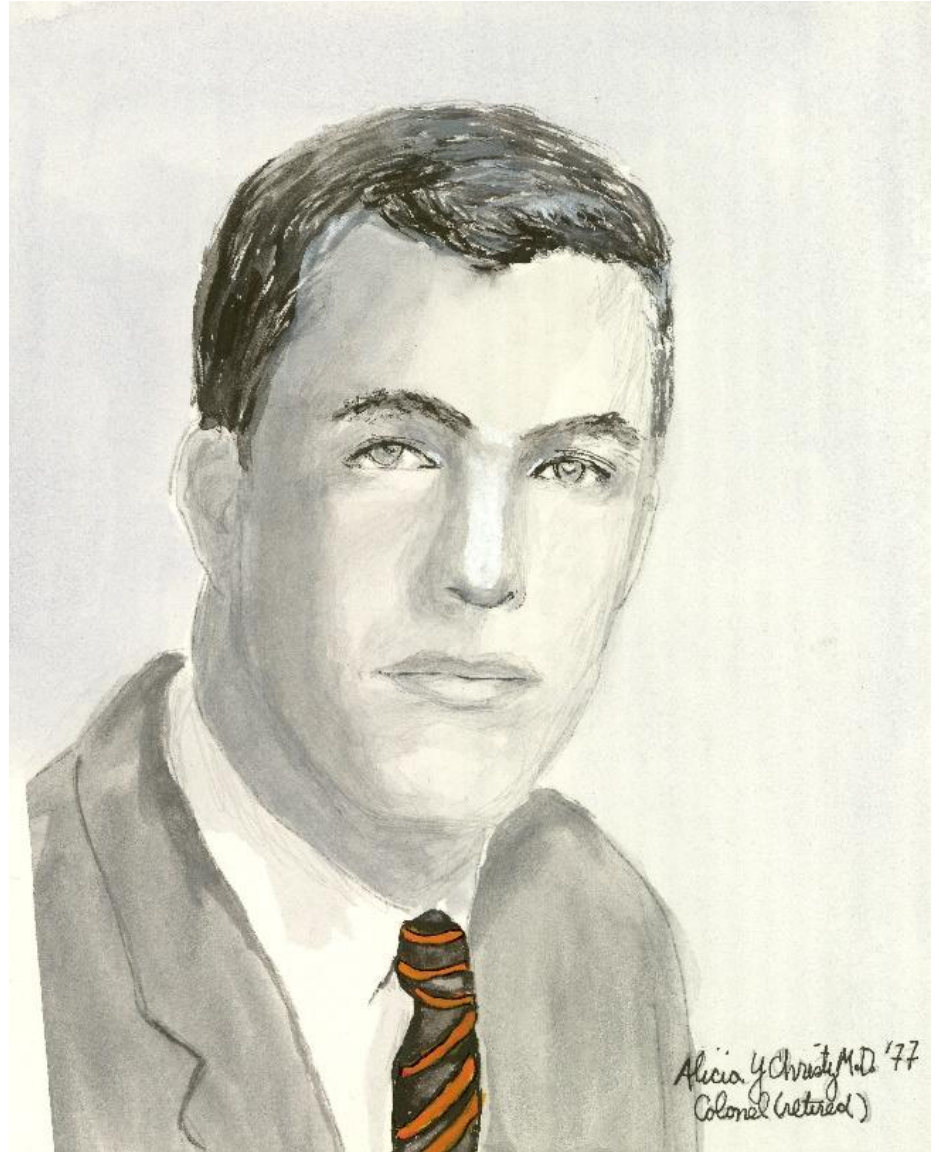
Vietnam Faces of the Fallen Princeton Class of 1966

Edwin Augustus Keeble, Jr.

Edwin Augustus Keeble Jr. was born to Edwin Keeble, a prominent architect, and Barbara Keeble (in Washington, D.C. on December 12th, 1944. Edwin Keeble Jr. was a student at Deerfield Academy in Deerfield, Massachusetts before entering Princeton University in 1962. While attending Princeton, Keeble became president of Cannon Club, and was also involved in lacrosse, Pistol Club and the *Semper Fidelis Society*. During his studies, he majored in English, writing his thesis on John Millington Synge and Irish Theatre. Keeble intended to join the Marines and then enter a career in politics following his graduation in 1966.

The year after graduating from Princeton, Edwin Augustus Keeble Jr. went to flight school in Pensacola, where he married his wife, Alice 'Happy' Orr. His experience in flight school led him to serve as a Marine helicopter pilot. After a brief assignment to North Carolina, in 1968 Keeble received orders to Vietnam, where he was assigned to the *Third Marine Amphibious Force, 1st MAW, Marine Aircraft Group 30, VMO 6* and achieved the rank of 1st Lieutenant. During his service, he was awarded the *Purple Heart* medal and the Air Medal. On February 28th, 1969, Keeble's helicopter was

shot down by enemy fire in the A Shau Valley, in *Quang Tri province*. He was 24 years old. Keeble was survived by his parents, siblings, and wife, and was buried at Arlington National Cemetery with full military honors the next month. A memorial scholarship was established at Deerfield Academy in his honor.
