Vietnam Faces of the Fallen Princeton Class of 1966

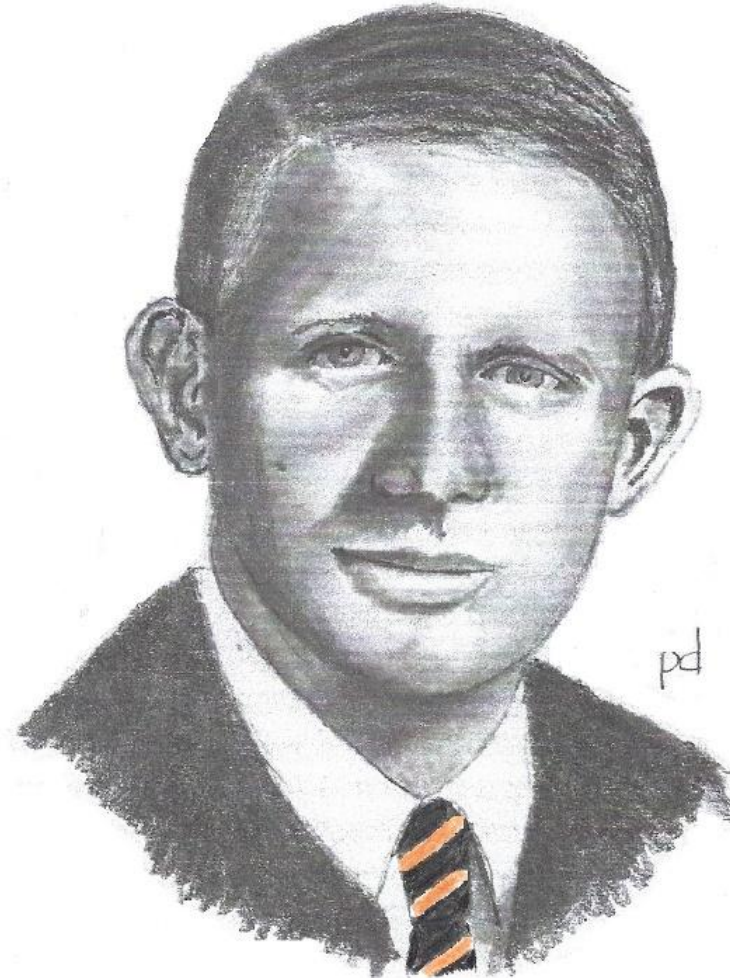
Warren Randolph Brundage Jr.

Warren Randolph Brundage Jr. was born on October 20th, 1944 in Brooklyn, New York, the son of Mr. and Mrs. W.R. Brundage Sr. He attended Wall High School, in Manasquan, New Jersey. While there, he was involved in the student council and the Honor Society, and became the captain of the football, basketball, and golf teams in his senior year. He earned an NROTC scholarship, and majored in politics at Princeton.

Working with Professor Falkner of the Politics Department, he wrote his thesis on the enforcement of the Civil Rights Act of 1964. He was a member of Cottage Club and the Pre Law Society, played football and golf, and was an officer in multiple Navy ROTC programs.

He had planned to attend law school after he completed his service. Following graduation from Princeton in 1966, Brundage embarked on a tour of duty with the Marine Corps. As a Marine, he achieved the rank of 2nd Lieutenant and trained to become a navigator-bombardier.

On July 16th, 1967, Brundage lost his life when the navy plane carrying him and several other trainees crashed in Georgia. He was 22 years old. Brundage was survived by his parents and sister.
