

2026 Procedure for Community Service Quilt Donations Effective July 28, 2026

Guidelines for Contributing Quilts

Community Service is welcoming quilts for the following charities:

- Southwest Family Advocacy - Teen Boys & Girls
 - Hospice of the Valley - Adult Quilts
 - Hospice of the Valley - Wheel Chair Quilts
- Hospice of the Valley partnering with Ryan House - Children's quilts
 - Luke Air Force - Baby quilts.

These are the charities PCQ currently supports. **Please refer to Quilt Size Guidelines** using the website for the sizes needed to meet their needs.

Donation Intake Process for Quilt Tops

You may make only the top **OR** make the top, back, binding and request batting, your choice.

Once you have completed your quilt top and the donation form, place it in cabinet S104 in the bin marked tops only. This ensures all donations are properly processed and stored. If the cabinet is full, please contact Ronda Jones. Please don't find an alternative place to store your donated quilt. The Community Service Committee will complete the quilt and place it in the cabinet to be longarmed.

Donation forms are enclosed in the baggies, which include a label for the quilt and a safety pin for attaching it. The baggies are attached to the inside of cabinet 104S door. This form is also available on our website under forms for downloading.

Batting

If you are completing a charity quilt and intend to quilt it yourself, and would like to receive batting from the club, please submit a Batting Request Form through the website. It is essential that you provide the precise measurements of your **quilt top**. If you plan to quilt this project on the longarm, please ensure that your **backing fabric is at least 5 inches larger on all sides**.

Quilt Patterns

Patterns for making the suggested sizes are located in the binder within cabinet 104S. Extra copies of each pattern are available for your use.

Fabric Resources

Please be free to use your own fabrics; however, the Community Service cabinets offer a generous supply of materials organized as follows:

- Bins assorted by color
- Backings, bindings and larger lengths of 1 yard or more

- Flannels and homespun fabrics are recommended for their versatility and comfort.

Maintaining Organization

To provide an easy and efficient process for everyone, please keep the bins and cabinets tidy after every use by returning materials to their designated spots.

These steps aim to streamline the quilt donation process while providing resources and guidance for all participants.
