1. President Karen Bogadi called the meeting to order at 9am.
2. Vice President, Debbie reported the Spring Luncheon will be April 11. Start signing up. Donna will do social aspects. Budget for social is \$459 left for the year, also décor: \$500 for spring. Debbie and Donna will finalize plans tomorrow. Cobb Salad and Club Croissant will be lunch choices. The club will cover taxes and gratuities. Program will be to recognize long term members and show and tell. Also possibly have board members show first and last quilt made. Final count must be in by April 4. Start Reservations will begin as soon as contract is signed.

Beverly Kim will play piano as people arrive and possibly after. The board voted to pay for her lunch. Luncheon will be held in the ballroom.

3. Julie reviewed the classes scheduled for the next 2 months. The March classes are all listed on the calendar on the website.

Flyers in the HOA showcases. She requested that the info be put on the digital display. She is giving out more business cards as requested. 7. Community Service made \$304 at the Trash to Treasures
The committee took a tour of the SW Family Advocacy Center. They need teenage quilts for girls most. This means we need a place to donate some of the children's quilts we make. Mary will confirm this.
First in-person community service Sew Day will be this Saturday. Jan Ochterbeck will lead using a new pattern she designed. They are making kits. Donated some of their unused fleece to Campus Church who made tied blankets.
8. Ronda reported 185 items for the quilt show. Entries are now closed. Room assignments are done. Each room will have a Viewer's Choice award. Ready to go!
9. JoEllen has Quilts for Sale in the bottom display window. The Gallery will also have items for sale during the show.
10. Website, Ronda: Has received requests for non-members to join a small group. The board confirmed that they must be a club member before they could join a small group. She also shared the proposed plan for a possible revision to the CAC, which would greatly enlarge our space. This plan is still tentative and in the early planning stages.
11. Jonnie moved and Darlene seconded the motion to adjourn. Meeting was adjourned at 9:55am.

The meeting was called to order by President, Karen Bogadi at 7pm.

1. Carole Schumacher led Quilting 101 Graduation. All 13 students completed a 72 x 72-inch quilt. Each student had a mentor. Students and mentors came up, showed their quilt and received a certificate.
2. New members and guests were recognized.
3. Visitors are not to go out into the hallway after hours.
4. Julie Baird reviewed the scheduled classes. Jackie Cameron is doing 2 classes featuring multiple uses for HST, on 3-15 and 3-22. The Historical Quilt Class has been moved to the Eagles Nest Ballroom on 3-24. On 3-31, Square your Quilt class will be taught by Linda Shaver. In April, Applique class by Kathy Brown on 4-12. Mary Ann Bottef will teach the Wee Draw Bag class on 4-14. George is showing how to use the Go Cutter on 4-15. Helen Phillips will teach the Pineapple Class on 4-21, Darlene Helker and Pam McWhorter will teach the Twister Tray Class on 4-24. All March classes are on the website and April will be added soon.
5. Barb Mauer, quilt Show: The Quilt Challenge is already in the Windows. The Color Quilts are hanging on the hallway. Thursday, after 2:30 – 4pm: They need over the door hangers, trouser hangers, quilting hoops, drying racks, 2 step ladders or lightweight 3 step ladders. Friday: Chairs will be moved and put into ceramics room for the program. Saturday: Bring in quilts between 9-12. Pin the paper receipt to the back of the quilt. Sunday: Quilt Show from 10 – 4. Still need workers. Take down at 4pm. Line up and pick up your quilts and other equipment. If you are coming from home, better to come about 4:30/4:45 to pick up. Take quilts to car and secure it. Other equipment will be put in the hall outside ceramics room, arranged alphabetically. Be sure all extra items are labeled. Speaker will present at 11am and 2pm. Chairs are limited. She will present a Historical review of quilts from 1800 to modern quilts. Uses small samples. Review of how women's lives have changed over time.
