Board Meeting, May 3, 2021

Attendance: Ronda Jones, Patsy Wagner, George Wagner, Marka Locker, Chris Booth, Linda Rowe, Roberta Penchina, Linda Publicover, Carol Moonan

President: Ronda called the meeting to order at 9:00 am.

The stored chairs have been removed from the window area in the room thanks to the persistence of Cheryl Neel. If extra chairs are needed, we can get them from the Art Room.

The CAC summer schedule starts this Saturday, May 8. The CAC building will be open from 9-noon on Saturdays.

Vice President: Holiday luncheon is scheduled for Monday, December 13.

Secretary: 10 notes were sent out in April. Linda Rowe will take minutes during the May General Meeting.

Treasurer: \$400 in education expenses, \$5500 in checking, \$9700 in longarm savings account.

Publicity: Linda will feature the Charity Fundraising Quilt in the May article. She will interview Ronda for a future article about what it was like to run the Quilt Club during the pandemic.

Community Service Report: April Service Project was making Fidget mats. Alzheimer's Assn was very pleased to receive almost 40 mats. Two mats have been sold. Patsy will discuss possibly putting them into the gallery with JoEllen.

Saturday May 15 is the next sew day to make Kid's Quilts. Since the room now closes at noon, participants might have to bring them home to complete them.

Programs: Chris Booth will organize a class, "Christmas in July" on July 13. She is also planning an Ice Cream Social for the summer, possibly in August when we can schedule something indoors.

May 22-23 is the Global Quilt Connection. Nine teachers each day. Ronda will send out instructions and the time schedule of the classes that will be held. Each class is 15 minutes. Recommended that you sign on at beginning of the time and then you are assured to have a place.

May 27, 12-4pm, Helen Phillips will teach a binding class.

Long Arm: Roberta reported that Ron Paul was here, working for 3.5 hours. He was not able to fix the Vertical and Horizontal holds. Other than that, all is working.

The board discussed the possibility of buying another commercial Gammill longarm now that we have a little more space (without the stored chairs), but it appears we are able to meet the need to use the machine. When the weekly email is sent out and there is an opening during that week for someone to use the machine, then anyone qualified can register to use the machine. This will not affect your "once every 3 weeks" requirement.

New Business:

Room Schedule: Hopefully by June 1, our schedule will return to pre-pandemic times, with the ability to check out a key to use before and after hours. This is expected to happen, unless we have a local outbreak of the virus – but not yet definite.

Starting today, each club in the CAC is responsible to maintain their own headcount. No more registration for room required. Up to 12 people are allowed in the room. If you arrive when the room is full, you may not enter. The CAC will not be checking rooms.
