8.) Veteran Quilts and 50 Star Quilt: Linda Rowe: 24 members volunteered to sew Veterans quilts, many providing their own fabrics, several took kits home to sew. Thus far, 6 quilts are completed.

5 quilt tops were started at the Veterans sew day.

2 additional quilt members submitted quilts that were not anticipated.

There are 5 quilts left over from last year, so Linda feels we are doing very well.

New this year are custom embroidered labels with the recipient's name on them.

The 50 star quilt project will only have 48 stars. Barbara VanTrumps block was given to Her family members. Another was unable to be completed.

Carla Peccianti may provide the quilting.

The completed quilt will be entered in the Arizona State Fair, and then become the 2023 Opportunity Quilt.

General Meeting 9 May 2022

Attendance: 48 in the Art Room

1. President Karen Bogadi called the meeting to order at 7pm. There were no new members or visitors.
2. Last month's minutes are posted online. No comments, questions or corrections.
3. Ronda was thanked profusely for her efforts at setting up and maintaining the website for many years. Maureen Strachen will take over the website.
4. Debbie Arsenault has the bobbins to purchase. See her if you ordered one.
5. Darlene reported some of the major expenses for last month. Balances are Checking \$5669.55., Longarm Savings: \$10,909.50, Petty Cash, \$50, For a total of \$16,629.05.
6. Darlene also presented programs since Julie is out of town:

No shame train tomorrow from 9-3. May 12, Jan O teaching machine binding. May 19/26 Pumpkin Table Runner by Wendy Gilbert. May 20, Go Cutter taught by George Wagner. June 7, No Shame Train Activity TBD, June 16, Curves by Karen Bogadi, June 23, Disappearing Block by Carlene Peccianti. July 5, No Shame Train, July 7, Hot Pad Holder by Linda Rowe.

Question was raised about being able to offer some of these classes via Zoom for members who are out of town for the summer. Discussion followed. It is doubtful it would be possible to do an inperson class as well as zoom at the same time. If an instructor wishes to do so, we have a tripod in the closet with the quilt frames.

7. Mary Hill thanked everyone for doing Charity Quilts. She has Adopt a Quilt Kits to be taken. May 21 is next Community Sew Day. No new program – opportunity to finish items already started.
8. Linda Rowe spoke about Veteran's Quilts. They should be turned in to her as they are completed. The 50 Star State Project quilt was shown. It measures 73 x 96. It will be quilted by Karen Bogadi and entered into the AZ State Fair, then used as the 2023 Opportunity Quilt.
9. Expansion of the CAC. The HOA is in favor of the expansion. Quilters will double their space. Plans will now go to the architect. \$200,000 will be needed to be contributed to fund the renovation. This will be from all the users of the building, not just quilters.
10. Carole Schumacher spoke about a quilt retreat in Glendale in August 22-25. Also plan to have one in November and April. Can have up to 16 but a minimum of 8. \$140 per person, does not include food. She still has several spaces, see her if you are interested.
11. Next meeting is June 13 in the Art Room. No July or August meeting this year.
12. Pam moved and Lea Morse seconded the motion to adjourn the meeting. The meeting adjourned at 7:24pm.
