Raffle: Phyllis and Karen announced a raffle to start fundraising for 2027. When members learned about the plan to have a bigger and better show, the response was overwhelming. Carole Schumacher donated \$100.00 and challenged others to do the same. Other members pledged to take the challenge and Cynthia Schwartz pledged \$500.00. A robust conversation ensued with the suggestion to cancel the 2025 show and focus on fundraising and planning for 2026.

Because the board, elected by the members and charged with directing club activities and ensuring fiscal responsibility, had already voted on the 2025 quilt show and budgeted funds accordingly, a decision could not be made during the General Meeting. We voted unanimously to cancel the 2025 show and empowered the Quilt Show co-chairs to focus on the fundraising and planning necessary to have a larger quilt show in a ballroom.
