Dear Ms. Akers & Mr. Curley,

We received the City of Double Horn's June quarterly compliance update on June 13, 2022. I apologize for the delay in responding.

We appreciate the details provided in this latest update. It appears from the report that the city's expanded city hall is now available, which will provide more room for city meetings as well as become a possible future polling location. The report also indicates that additional progress has been made toward funding and improving street signage and lighting in collaboration with the DHIA, and that the installation of the fire suppression water tank is underway and should soon be completed. The report also indicates that further progress on surveying community interest in trash and recycling services as well as feasibility for water services and corresponding conservation efforts is ongoing. We look forward to your final September update at the end of the one-year period of the Assurance of Voluntary Compliance (AVC).
