**03/15/22 UPDATE:** The City has continued to take a proactive approach by investigating potable water service options as we plan for the long-term growth of the city. Double Horn Creek Water Supply Corporation (DHCWSC) is the most viable option to date. The City Council formally authorized the Mayor to begin planning discussions; at a minimum, the City will need to understand what limitations and/or requirements may exist if the water service area were to be expanded and what role DHCWSC would play. On March 4th, the city was notified that the DHCWSC unanimously agreed to begin discussions. Discussions are tentatively planned to begin later this month pending confirmation of availability by all parties. Additionally, President Raetz provided an update to the City Council on the process to develop a well if a landowner desires to do so. To help landowners with this process, information, including Ground Water Conservation District contact information will be documented and added to the City's website.
