

About the Preacher

Rev. Dr. Wendell O. E. Christopher, Sr. is the son of Mernella Christopher. He is the oldest of five siblings. From an early age, he had an affinity for the Church and that was evident when he began singing at the age of five while attending the Evening Light Evangelical Church on Parsons Road. He joined a youth Group sponsored by the late Ms. Nellie Swan and this proved to be a pivotal point in his development, as it afforded him the opportunity to become a member of the Hamilton Cathedral Choir. After a few years, he was trained to be a Server at the Great Alter and subsequently became 'Bishop's Server'.

In 1966 he was invited by the young people of Vernon Temple A.M.E. Church to be a panelist on their Annual Youth Program. It was this encounter with the A.M.E. Church that awoke his desire to leave the Evangelical Church and become a member of Vernon Temple under the Pastorate of the late Rev. Richard Parker. He quickly rose through the ranks of the Young People's Department and the Youth Choir to become President and Business Manager respectively. He also excelled in the Richard Allen Youth Council and became 1st Episcopal District Vice-President of that Organization under the leadership of the late Mrs. Melva Campbell.

Rev. Christopher's singing career was blooming at that time, and he was a founding member of the Gospel Group called The Disciples and had a successful tour as an R&B singer with the band the Dynamics. However, the Church was his first love, and he never strayed away from it. His call to the Ministry was no surprise to anyone except himself. He received his Exhorter's license in 1968 under the Rev. John Brandon. After fulfilling the requirements of the Conference School of Religious Studies and In-service training, he was refused admittance to the 1973 Annual Conference. After much discussion and no action by the Annual Conference Board of Examiners, and the desire to further his education, he decided to leave the Island and pursue his call overseas.

He attended Kittrell Junior College in Kittrell, North Carolina where he obtained his Associates Degree in Business Administration. He also attended Shaw University in Raleigh, NC where he obtained his Bachelor of Science Degree in Business Administration, and his Bachelor of Divinity Degree. He attended the University of North Carolina at Asheville, Asheville NC, and is a Graduate of Leadership Asheville and The Seminary of the Apostles in Virginia Beach, Virginia where he obtained his Master of Divinity Degree. On August 25, 2012, he received an Honorary Doctorate of Humane Letters Degree from the Seminary of the Apostles. Virginia Beach, Va.

He was admitted to the Western North Carolina Annual Conference in 1973 and was promoted to 1st years study class in the same year. He was ordained a Deacon in 1974 by Bishop Henry Wendell Murph and was given the Pastoral charge of Davis Memorial A.M.E. Church on campus, thereby making him a College Chaplain. He was ordained an Itinerant Elder in 1976.

He has received many Honors, Awards and Citations for his outstanding Leadership and Service to the Communities in Baltimore, MD, Annapolis, MD and Asheville, NC where he served as Board Chairman, Board Member and Director of many Community organizations. He was Board Chairman of C.O.U.C.H. Organization, Baltimore, MD and a Board Member of the Banneker Douglas Museum in Annapolis, MD. He was elected four times to be the Delegate to the A.M.E. General Conference in the Baltimore Annual Conference and the Washington Annual Conference.

He presently serves as Pastor of St. Philip A.M.E after pastoring for fifty years in the United States and is the Chair of the Social Action Committee for the Bermuda Annual Conference.

Rev. Christopher is married to the love of his life Karen, and is the father of four children, Wendell Jr., Chris, Rashon, and Kryshae and daughters-in-law Tiffany and Kelly. He has four grandchildren Dorjon, Amonte, Kamron and August.

His favorite scripture is found in Phil. 4:13 and his favorite song is "Great Thy Faithfulness".
