

ANNEXURE A

Special Resolution



The Clubs constitution has not been reviewed nor updated since its inception in 1991. The changes proposed are designed to address current legal requirements, contemporary practices and technology and governance policy that the committee considers to be in the best interests of the Club.

1. Revoke the Clubs current constitution in its entirety
2. Adopt the Queensland Department of Fair Trading draft model rules/constitution (as set out in Annexure B) in its entirety with the following variations which the committee feels better serves the needs of the Gold Coast Tweed Bonsai Club.
