The Mission of the Military Order of the Purple Heart is to foster an environment of Camaraderie among Combat Wounded Veterans to promote Patriotism and serve the Veterans and our Communities. The Military Order of the Purple Heart accomplishes this mission by providing services to all veterans and their families through our programs such as Suicide Awareness, Scholarship, Legislative, Purple Heart Trail, Software Developer Training, Youth Activities, Veterans Advocacy, and MOPH Disaster Relief Fund.

We are dedicated to our Country and our Veterans Community, and we will endeavor to do better for each other by each other always.

Our members are Combat wounded Veterans who have received the Purple Heart for wounds suffered in combat or by an act of terrorism. Although our membership is restricted to the combat wounded, we support all veterans and their families with a myriad of nationwide programs by Chapters and Departments.

MOPH PROGRAMS

Suicide Awareness and Prevention: The program provides our members with education, resources, and tools to join in the fight to end suicide. We provide a course targeted to empower Veterans, Peers, and/or family members to ask the right questions, persuade a person in crisis to seek help, and provide resources in their local areas. We strive to save lives by networking and partnering with other Veteran Service organizations, Mental Health Programs, and advocacy groups with the goal to end suicide.

Youth Activities: Programs are focused on fostering patriotism and good citizenship among America's youth. We recognize outstanding leadership in cadets and midshipmen through the Senior and Junior ROTC Programs in the United States and Department of Defense Dependent Schools worldwide. In addition, we recognize outstanding leadership in non-ROTC/JROTC Youth Programs including members of the Young Marines, Civil Air Patrol, Naval Sea Cadets, Boys and Girls Scouts, and Pre-JROTC Mid-School Programs.

Advanced Education Scholarship Program:

A competitive program that awards scholarships to Purple Heart recipients and their spouses, children, and grandchildren each year. At least one applicant with military service will be awarded the Navy SEAL LT Michael Murphy Memorial Award.

Employment Training: The Military Order of the Purple Heart and Redding Software Corporation are working together to provide MOPH members, veterans, or family members of MOPH members with free Software Developer training. Each year 15 people are chosen for our free training program/internship. The internship lasts for one year since most employers like to hire programmers with at least one year of experience. Priority will be given to MOPH members.

Women Veterans Issues: The program's mission is to aid Women Veterans by providing information and assistance to resolve issues inside and outside of the Order. Provide relevant information on improvements and updates to the VA's Women Veterans Programs. Advocate for positive change through partnerships, training, and the exchange of information. We will identify barriers that will hinder progression to achieve goals and recommend outreach activities for women and their families both members and non-members. Speak at events providing information on women's benefits and achieving goals.

Veterans Advocacy: The Military Order of the Purple Heart (MOPH) is committed to serving our veterans. Although our membership is restricted to combat-wounded men and women, we support all of our veterans. Our current initiatives for veterans include consistently assessing the needs of our members and disseminating relevant information to them to address their needs and advocate on their behalf.
