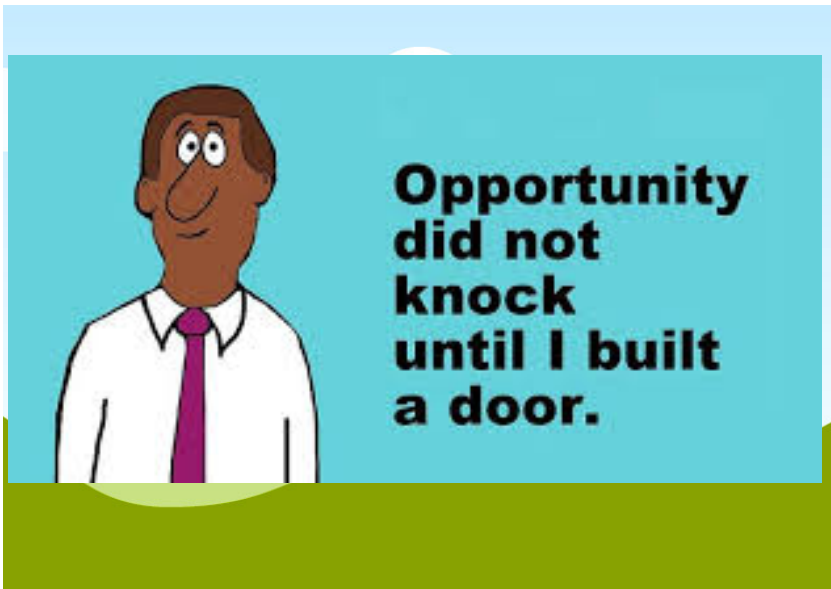

First Emoji: The first emoji was created in 1999 by Shigetaka Kurita, a Japanese artist. He designed a set of 176 12x12 pixel images for a mobile internet platform called i-mode.

First World Wide Web Page: The first web page, which served as the foundation of the World Wide Web, was created by Tim Berners-Lee in 1991. It contained information about the World Wide Web project itself.

First YouTube Video: The first video uploaded to YouTube was titled "Me at the zoo" and was uploaded by Jawed Karim, one of the co-founders of YouTube, on April 23, 2005.

First Smartphone: The first modern smartphone, known as the IBM Simon, was introduced in 1992. It had a touchscreen display and could send emails, faxes, and even had limited web browsing capabilities
