About our Project

This new system categorizes works based on theme and topic, regardless of race and background. Those that **can** be categorized go into 130-170 sections, while those that **cannot** be categorized fall under 110-129 Philosophical Traditions by Region. There are works from diverse racial backgrounds under each section – sections are no longer dedicated to particular races or origins. **The inherent Eurocentrism within the Dewey Decimal System is thereby reduced.**
