3	Q Okay. Do you recall what the circumstances were
4	or just ran into them?
5	A I just ran into them.
6	Q Okay. Did you converse with them very long then?
7	A At that particular time that was just like a hi,
8	bye.
9	Q Okay. What was the next time you had any contact
10	or conversation with Mr. Herrick?
11	A I seen him a few times like working out back when
12	I was working on my pond in back.
13	Q On your what?
14	A I was working on a pond in back. I was building
15	a pond for my turtle at the time.
16	Q I see. And is that part of the property of the
17	triplex there, the area that you refer to as the back?
18	A Yes.
19 -	Q Okay. Is that actually behind?

24	but talked for awhile off and on different times.
25	Q Okay. Was he ever inside your home?

1	A Yes, he was.
2	Q When was that or what were the circumstances?
3	A He was inside my house a couple of times. I
4	would invite him in for a drink and I believe he even was
5	he had been in and watched a movie with XXX at one
6	time, him and Pat.
∞7	Q Was there any other social occasions? You said
8	you invited him in for a drink.
9	A Yeah, you know, they are outside, you know, like
10	iced tea, yeah.
11	Q I see.
12	A Yeah.
13	Q Was he in your place can you remember any
14	other times he was in the home when you were there that yo
15	were aware of?
16	A He was in the home a few times.
17	Q Uh-huh. Okay.
18	A And the one that lived next door was the
19 ′	landlord's son.
20	Q Did you ever play chess with him?
21	A Did I? No, I did not.

A The door closed but then -- then about three seconds after that I yelled not my son and then he had gone this way and, so, I opened the door and I went in and looked to make sure my son was okay. Then I went out this way and he was -- he had --

- Q Is that the living/dining room area?
- A This is the dining room here there.
- Q Uh-huh.

A There is no wall. There is glass doors here, living room here. He had gone to the glass door, was trying to escape out the glass door. I came to the hallway right here and I told him no, you can't get out that way, go out the front door, just get out.

O Uh-huh.

A And at that time he told me to back up. So, I backed up a little bit and he went from the glass door where he had left my blood on the door from his hands and he proceeded to go through the kitchen and then around there. At that time there was light coming from the

1 kitchen, the venetian blinds here, very, very sufficient 2 light. 3 0 Where was the --Α Because David's light was right here and it was 5 very bright and it's shining through the kitchen right here 6 and when he came through here I saw his face, and it was 7 indeed Kevin which I speculated here because of his body shape. He's dumpy, you can tell, there is rolls of fat, and 8 9 so, he went out the front door and around. 10 I proceeded to chase him down here. Then there 11 is another building here. He had stopped about right here. 12 Would you put an S where he stopped? 13 He stopped and I come around here and I again 14 positively identified him at that time also. How, I mean? 15 0 Because --16 Α 17 What were the lighting conditions there? Q 18 Α It was clear sky, moon. 19 Q Okay. There is no street lights there though? 20 A Good question. I'm not really sure. Possibly. 21 But I have excellent night vision. 22 Did he and you exchange any kind of words during 23 this chase? 24 Α During the chase, no. 25 0 Okay.

He ran down a couple of houses and he had gone in between the side of a building and a bush and I had slowed down to stop and I made sure I didn't blindly chase after him in such an area because he could have slit my throat.

Now, did you -- so that you basically stopped chasing him when he ran between the buildings?

No, I chased after him and I had thought he might have hopped the fence back here which goes into an apartment complex which I found indeed he did not, he just circled around, hopped a couple of fences.

- How did you find that out?
- That he had not hopped the fence?

Because when I had come back around and I was at the house for awhile he had come out of the front door, and when he originally first came out he had greased his hair, he had greased it back to make it look short with oil or mousse or whatever you use.

You lost me. You chase him up to the fence but you didn't see where he went after that.

I can see where he went after around the corner

I see. Did you at any time talk to anybody about a car and a tag number?

Α Yes, I did.

2	A Because when I had jumped the fence I had saw a
3	car with the lights on right here.
4	Q Leaving the apartment complex?
5	A No, it was parked there.

7	A And I thought perhaps he had jumped in that but I

10	the license plate because I had to tell them something and

24	Q I see. So, when you came in upon and found this
25	person on your friend

A When I was in the bedroom and I was against the window I saw the silhouette of his body and I saw he had his hair slicked back close to his scalp.

Q Wasn't fluffed up or curly?

A No, he usually has it fluffed up and curly about this far off his head.

Q An inch or two?

A About two inches off his head and he had it greased back.

Q Okay. In the course of fighting with him did you have occasion to touch his hair or do you recall any sensation of touching?

A No, I did not touch his hair.

Q So, you --

A But I saw the light gleaming off of it, so, I know it was matted down with some mousse or oil of some kind.

Q So, after you pursued him to the point where you saw him in between the houses --

A Uh-huh.

Q -- then you said you followed through and went back as far as the fence and you saw the car in the parking lot, correct? Am I correct so far in saying you did not see him between the houses but you went that far after hesitating briefly?

Т	A I hesitated yes, to make sure he wasn't hiding
2	behind the bush.
3	Q I see.
4	A Now, I did not see after he had turned the corner
5	until he had come out of the door that he was living in.
6	Q So, then you went back home?
.7	A I had yes, after I went to the fence I had
8	jumped over the fence, looked at the car and then I went
9	back to the house.
10	Q Okay. What route did you take going back?
11	A The same route that I took going there.
12	Q Okay. And who was the first person you saw when
13	you headed back?
14	A It was Dave and Barb.
15	Q Okay. What was going on when you got there?
16	A was crying hysterically. I told them to
17	call the police and an ambulance.
18	Q I'm sorry, was outside or inside when you
19	got back?
20	A When I got back at that time she was outside.
21	Q I see.
22	A And she went back inside.
23 ·	Q Where were Dave and Barbara?
24	A In front of their door.
25	Q Did you see Mrs. Porrey at this time?

1	A No, at that time she came out shortly after that.
2	Q What was doing? She was crying
3	hysterically?
4	A She was extremely hysterical.
5	Q Did she have the baby with her or was she out
6	there by herself?
7	A Yes, she had the baby with her.
8	Q And what was she wearing? What was
9	wearing at the time, do you recall?
10	A I don't see how that's is there any relevance
11	to it?
12	Q The judge can rule on that later, but in the
13	meantime I just need to have a full picture of what
L4	happened. If you recall what she was wearing.
15	A I do not recall.
L6	Q I suspect it was not very important to you at the
L7	time, but I just want to know if you remember.
L8	A No, I do not recall.
L9 ·	Q So, what did you do when you got back after you
20	asked Dave or Barbara to call the police?
21	A Yeah, told them to call the police and then I was
22	in the courtyard awhile and I was back in the house and I
23	got in the courtyard.
24	The first time I saw Kevin after inside the house
25	he came out here, he had poufed his hair up but there was

had no shirt on that particular time. was not in the courtyard, she was inside.

- Q Were the police --
- A No, the police were not there and his pants were still undone and then he put on a shirt at that point. He had it in his hand.
- Q Do you recall if he had a belt with his jeans?

 Do you have any memory of a belt or a buckle either on what you saw when you went into the bedroom?
 - A I heard a belt buckle.
 - Q Okay. I see.
 - A In the house.
- Q Okay. Did a belt buckle or belt register on you when you saw him in the courtyard?
 - A No, I was looking at his face.
- Q Okay. And you're saying his hair was, what poufed out or it was in it's usual condition, curly and kind of fluffy?
- A He had poufed it out. There was still remnants of the grease or mousse, whatever, around the edges.
 - Q So, his forehead looked damp or glassened?
- A It was glassened, not his forehead, his hair, up under his hairline. Okay.
 - Q Was Mrs. Porrey there when you saw him?

1	A Yes.
2	Q Okay.
3	A I believe so.
4	Q What was Kevin doing or saying when you spotted
5	him there?
6	A Nothing, not a word.
7	Q Okay. And Mrs. Porrey, what was she doing or
8	saying?
9	A She was hysterical herself after she saw the
10	blood all over my chest.
11	Q What did you do next after you asked your
12	neighbors to call the police? Did you go back inside?
13	A Yes, I went back inside with and tried to
14	calm her down.
15	Q Okay. Did you have any more dealings with any of
16	the neighbors before the police arrived?
17	A I didn't really talk to anybody.
18	Q Now, did you have any conversation wit
19 ·	about who it was who attacked her?
20	A Well after I had gotten back she had I was
21	coming in to talk to her and I said did you see who did it,
22	and she said I didn't get a good look but it looked like
23	the guy next door. And I said it was.
24	Q Okay. Did you have any discussion with her about
25	and No.

1	A No, I did not have any discussion at the time.
2	Q Okay. Was it more than a few minutes before the
3	police or the paramedics arrived?
4	A No, it wasn't. They were extremely sufficient
5	and quick.
6	Q Prior to your leaving the hospital did you see
7	Kevin Herrick anymore?
8	A When I was when they were rolling me out on
9	the stretcher he was at the door.
10	Q Okay. Did you notice or realize that you were
11	not too healthy at that point? Did you notice anything he
12	said or did at that time?
13	A He didn't say a word. I stared at him and he
14	stared at me.
15	Q Okay. Did the police ask you at that time if you
16	could identify the person?
17	A Yes. All I told them was his hair was slicked
18	back.
19	Q Okay. Could you tell us why you did not identify
20	Kevin Herrick at that time?
21	A Yes, I had a feeling that the judicial system
22	would not be stern enough on such a heinous crime and at
23	the time I wanted to kill him because he had threatened to
24	kill my son, rape my girlfriend and tried to kill me.
25	Q So, it was your intention at that time to deliver

1 some justice of your own? 2 That is correct. Α 3 Okay. Did you discuss that idea with 0 before you went to the hospital? 5 A No, I did not. 6 So, when you got to the hospital were you .7 admitted to the hospital? Were you admitted as an 8 in-patient or were you treated and then released from the 9 hospital? 10 Α Treated and then released. 11 Have you had any follow-up treatment? Q 12 Α I had to go back a couple of times but --13 Okay. Q 14 -- I have a very thick chest plate. Α I was very 15 fortunate. I was very lucky. It almost punctured a lung. 16 Have you had any conversation -- well, tell me this. At what point did you make the identification to the 17 18 police? 19 Α When I had gotten back from the hospital I'd 20 gotten a ride from Dave over to mother's house. 21 did not tell the police until I called them from her house. 22 Did you have a change of heart about your plans? I was extremely outraged and it was -- and I just 23 24 thought about it and in today's society no matter what the 25 circumstances are murder is not acceptable.

1 Q Okay. 2 And, so, I was going to let the law just take care of it and hope that they do, in fact, you know, give 3 justice to the crime. So, what did you do when you made that decision? 5 6 Α I called the police. 7 Okay. 8 Α I have a question. Well --9 10 Α Okay. I'll wait until after we're done. 11 Let's wait until we're all done. Q 12 Have you had any discussions with Theresa Porrey 13 about this incident? Have you had any conversation with 14 her about what happened that night or whether or not it was Kevin Herrick? 15 16 What are you referring to? 17 Well, obviously since -- since the incident until 18 today have you discussed it with her? 19 Discussed it with her, no, I haven't had any 20 conversations with her. 21 Well, I mean has she -- what I would like to know 22 is whether she has ever challenged the accuracy or your 23 identification or whether you have otherwise had any 24 conversations with her about the identification. 25 No, she did say she couldn't believe it because A

this guy lived in her house, but then again I had heard a conversation where she was talking to somebody that she said she didn't believe it either, but yet in the same breath she said she had gone in his room and found his socks were wet.

- A It was either the day after or couple of days after, the exact date I don't recall.
- Q Did you hear her make any other statements concerning the incident?
- A Not really, just that I identified him and that she had found the socks that were wet.
- Q Did she -- and she said nothing else that you recall in that conversation?
- A She said other things. As far as word for word quotations, anything else it would just be purely speculation.
- Q Well, what was the sense of anything else that she said?
- A The lady doesn't always make so much sense.

 She's not exactly stable.
- Q Okay. So, she didn't say anything else that made any sense to you, is that what you are saying, other than
