gentlemen, this is a case of brutality and violence. The evidence in the case will show that back in July

What this was was a U-shaped triplex. lived on the east side of the triplex. Right across from her lived David Stewart and his wife Barbara, and on the south side, adjacent to both of them, lived the landlady who was Theresa Porrey, her son who was Patrick Porrey and another person was living there at the time on a temporary basis. That person was the

lived with her four-month-old baby he goes by the name of The Defendant was staying

at that apartment only for a couple of weeks before the incident that we're talking about here. The Defendant became acquainted with and with over that period. As a matter of fact, the Defendant came over a couple times for a barbecue, and that sort of thing.

On the day in question, which is July the 14th, 1989, was home alone with the baby and the Defendant came over. It was a little before six and the Defendant stated that he wanted to play chess with wasn't home yet so agreed to play chess with him for a while, and that's what they did. And then came home from work at about six, and the three of them had plans to go to a drive-in movie because that's about the best place to take a newborn when you're breast feeding, and that sort of thing.

So the Defendant left, and and and and the baby went to the drive-in movie and then they came back. At that point put the baby to bed in his crib in his room and she took a bath. At that point went over to David's house, which is right across from his apartment, and just went over there to say hi to David. David asked for help because he has a saltwater fish tank and the fish were dying.

He needed help to take the fish tank over to David's mother's house to help save the fish because her water was okay and his saltwater was all messed up.

So this was about midnight, and came over and told that he was going over there. She said fine, and and David went over to David's mother's house. Checked on the baby, and she turned on the hall light and she went into her bedroom and she fell asleep on her bed. She did not know it at the time, but she was about to become a victim.

She was sleeping and something woke her up, and that something was the Defendant Mr. Herrick.

Mr. Herrick broke into the house; the Defendant shut off the hall light; the Defendant took off his clothes. The Defendant got on top of _______, he had one knee on each side of her body. At this point _______ woke up and observed this. The Defendant held a knife or a scalpel to her throat. He said, "Suck it or I'll kill the baby."

Defendant had his clothes off. He managed to stick his penis into ______'s mouth. The Defendant continued to state that he would kill her baby. The Defendant moved his knife down to her underwear.

At this point came home from David's

mother's house. He was in the courtyard area outside of his residence and he was smoking a cigarette. does that because he doesn't like to smoke in the house. He heard crying and it became louder and louder. He then rushed into the house when he heard his fiancee crying, and he saw the Defendant on top of The Defendant then got off of and stated that he would kill and that he would kill the baby. They struggled in the doorway. The Defendant then stabbed twice with the knife or the scalpel that he had, once in the upper part of the he got a good look at the attacker, the Defendant, the next-door neighbor Kevin Herrick.

The Defendant put his pants on. Moved toward the Defendant -- moved toward the Defendant, but the Defendant was waving the knife or the scalpel, so backed off. The Defendant ran out of the bedroom door at that point. ran to the door and the Defendant stated, "Get away from the door or I'll kill your baby." Defendant let go of the door. then ran to the baby's room to see if the baby was okay, and she was hysterical at the time. The baby was okay.

The Defendant then tried to get out of the house

through the sliding glass doors in the living room.

Those doors were locked and he was unable to get out of there, and did follow him there. Now at this point the light from the moon and the light from David's apartment was shining through the venetian blinds and it was bright enough for to see who this person was for sure, and it was the Defendant.

The sliding glass door was locked. The Defendant then went out the front door and he went eastbound on chased after him. The Defendant stopped for a moment and he got another look at the attacker, and it was the Defendant. It was Kevin Herrick. The Defendant went eastbound and then he went southbound toward the back of his bedroom where he does have sliding glass doors and where there are sliding glass doors into the living room of his apartment where he was staying.

and all, and he went back to the apartment. of course, was hysterical. She was screaming and crying, and all of the neighbors came out. An ambulance came. The police came. The police interviewed, and she will tell you that she told the police that night she thought that her attacker was

the Defendant Mr. Herrick. It was dark and she wasn't a hundred percent sure and she just couldn't believe that it would be him, but she was pretty darn sure that was him and that's what she told the police.

The police arrived, and the last person out of the apartment was the Defendant. He was the last person out in the courtyard. The police observed he was very nervous, and that made Officer Crosby rather suspicious right from the get go.

I'll tell you what was going on through mind and he'll tell you what was going on through his He had just been the victim of a stabbing, a rather brutal stabbing. His wife or his fiancee, the mother of his small child, the baby child, had just been raped and the Defendant's penis went into her mouth against her will. He was extremely angry at that point. His fiancee was extremely hysterical at that point. What was going on through his mind -- and he will tell you what was going on through his mind -- he didn't want to go through the criminal justice system at that point and wait a year and a half for everything to happen. He wanted to get his friends and he wanted to get this guy, that's what was going on through his mind. Whether that was right or whether that was rational, that's really not that

important. The fact is that is what was going on through his mind. He and his friends were going to get Kevin Herrick for doing those things.

The police asked him if he knew who it was who did this and initially he told the police, "No, I don't." He was then taken to the hospital and treated. And at that point, after and went to 's mother's house, he decided that the right thing to do would be to call the police, and that's what he did. He told the police that it was, in fact, the Defendant and that he had no doubt and never did have any doubt that it was the Defendant.

After you've heard all the evidence, I am convinced you will conclude that this Defendant is guilty of burglary because he broke into the house. He is guilty of a sexual battery on because he forced his penis into the mouth of against her will, and he is guilty of an aggravated battery because he stabbed against his will. Thank you very much.

THE COURT: Counsel for the defense?

MR. LEINSTER: As the judge admonished, what we say is not evidence. Neither Mr. Bulone nor I was present when all of this happened, so all we do is present to you the facts as we see them, respectively.

I see this case a little bit differently, that's probably not hard to believe.

This is a very, very small triplex. It's a U, a squared-off U, as you look at. Mr. Herrick lived in the middle, as you look straight into the triplex.

There are the neighbors on the right side and then there is and Now I'm going to get confused with the name of a dozen times because in my preparation he's referred to as and they refer to him as Remember and are the same guy, even if I don't.

What happens here is that, at least theoretically, Kevin Herrick knows that and live together and have a child together and sleep together. And yet sometime after midnight when, for a unique reason, is not home as he ordinarily would be, someone comes into a pitch black -- not my words, hers -- room and removes either all of their clothing or all of the clothing but a shirt, depending on which witness you listen to. She has gone to sleep at this point and is completely unaware of anything going on until someone is straddling her, as she puts it, with a knife to her throat.

She cannot make out who this is. It is pitch black in the house. The only thing that she says,

ultimately, as a clue to the identity of her assailant is that his hair was curly and long, which in those days would have been consistent with Mr. Herrick. His hair was longer and it is curly. That's it, that was her sole clue to what was going on. She became hysterical, rightly so.

About that time comes home. and the assailant get into a brief fight. Somehow during this fight the assailant manages to completely reclothe himself again and at that point is chased by out of the premises. Even at this point is a little hysterical. She grabs the child. She doesn't see the assailant as he leaves the premises at all. She simply sees her boyfriend chase after him.

The assailant has placed his hands on the sliding glass doors. According to , he left bloody prints on the sliding glass doors in his haste to get out of there. Those doors were closed. He then went to the front door because said the front door is open, which would have probably been clear to whoever came in anyway because that's how the person would have gotten in the place. Blood was again left by the assailant's hands on the doorknob of that house as he left. Prints were taken. They did not match Kevin

--

Herrick. According to , however, at this point he is now chasing Mr. Herrick who he has determined to be Mr. Herrick because in their chase Mr. Herrick turns around to look at him, which is pretty common for people who are racing away from the scene of the crime to stop and look back at the person chasing him.

For reasons I have not figured out and probably won't during this trial --

MR. BULONE: I object to how he feels about things and his own conclusions.

THE COURT: I'll let him continue.

MR. LEINSTER: is chasing this fellow who is,
I suppose, at least in theory, still armed with a
knife. He says he knows at this point that it's
Mr. Herrick, but continues to chase him for no
apparent reason. We're not exactly sure, depending on
which story was given, to which direction he chased
him whether he first chased him east and then south.
But in any event, the testimony will be, according to
or , that in this process a couple of
fences were leaped. At one point he saw a vehicle,
which he actually hopped over a fence to look at,
although he was sure that the occupant of the vehicle
was not the assailant.

By the time he comes back to the scene of the

crime everyone is milling in the middle of this small cove because is hysterical with the child. Theresa Poorly, who you will see on video and who is an invalid, is hysterical. Everybody there is basically hysterical and/or nervous. And when comes back it's not just that he doesn't tell the police, yes, it was Kevin Herrick. He leads them on a wild goose chase.

He comes back and tells his good friend Dave, who he was helping fix a fish tank, I got the license number of the car. Call the police with this license number. Well, the police respond quickly. They're at the scene. Prior to their arrival my client is out the door, the front door of his end of the building and in the company of XX and Dave. That's prior to the police being there. According to , he's told the police this fabrication about the car and the license tag to throw them off. He doesn't want them to exercise justice. He wants the opportunity to murder Kevin Herrick with his friends. So, he tells them a lie as to this car and the license. doesn't just tell them a lie. He tells his good friend Dave a lie and gets him involved.

Four hours later, after he goes to the hospital, he decides that he will now tell the police it was

Kevin Herrick. He told them the reason that he lied was because he wanted to take justice into his own hands. So, the following — it's the same day calendar—wise — afternoon when he goes to make his written statement under oath, he doesn't say that the reason he lied to the police was because he wanted to take justice into his own hands. He now changes the version and he said I was traumatized. He cleans it up for the record. He whitewashes it because he doesn't want to put in print that he actually wanted to murder Kevin Herrick; it doesn't look as good. So you change the story all together as to why he lied.

The police, in the meantime, have taken with Kevin Herrick's consent hair samples which is standard in these kind of cases. They have taken the sheets, they've gone through Mr. Herrick's room looking for evidence of this crime, they've done all of the lab work necessary to try to link Mr. Herrick to any of this. The fingerprints, all the forensics, nothing. Absolutely nothing points to Mr. Herrick as being the assailant.

doesn't have a clue and would not have a clue to this day that it was Mr. Herrick or anyone else, except for the fact that she was told so by

He told her. In addition to that, she

believes, although it is not true because somebody 1 told her -- I don't know who -- that the weapon with 2 3 's blood and Mr. Herrick's clothes with igwedge4 blood were found. I don't know who told her that, but it isn't true. So she never saw her assailant. The 5 only man responsible for Mr. Herrick's having to live 6 7 under the anxiety of these criminal charges for over a 8 year, the only living, breathing organism on this 9 planet that will be able to say it is him is an 10 acknowledged liar. 11 Now, there will be a lot of inconsistencies that

I won't go into now because they will emerge as the case goes on. I want you to recognize no matter how zealous the prosecutor and I become, we weren't witnesses. Everything that you have to know you're going to hear. And when one side or another says there's only one verdict, that's not true. You're going to find out what the verdict is and you're going to hear it right from there. And you're not going to hear anything from that's not one inconsistency after another. It just didn't happen this way.
