Indigenous Microplastics Research Project 2025/2026

The NAFP is leading efforts to monitor the environmental and human health impacts of microplastics. As microplastics are now pervasive across ecosystems, Indigenous Peoples are on the front lines of protecting communities and advancing awareness of this global challenge. In response, NAFP is launching the first-ever Indigenous-led research initiative focused on analyzing microplastics in rain and snow water, in collaboration with LeBeaud Labs at the Stanford University School of Medicine.

The mission is to protect water in the sky, and water in the bodies.

Our indigenous methodology includes old medicine (feathers baskets), and new medicine (technology) to analyze microplastics.
