Dear Mr. Natal,

My name is Charles Rahn, I have been appointed as Frank L. Amodeo's guardian. I am sending you this letter contemporaneously with my attorney, Brian Horwitz, notifying the warden's attorney of my status.

According to Mr. Amodeo he has provided you a brief description of the litigation that is currently undergoing; and to a lesser extent a description of the actions to be commenced; as we seek (1) to marshal Mr. Amodeo's estate; and (2) to nullify the already presumptively void criminal conviction. These courses of action are likely to involve extensive discussion that is of a confidential nature.

Which brings me to the primary purpose of this correspondence. I would like to ensure that I and the attorneys' staff member have access to the multi-purpose room for these discussions – again Mr. Amodeo's state extensive and many of the matters are necessarily confidential and privileged.

The attorneys are aware of the Bureau rules and will provide the appropriate surety of their employee's behavior. But, I would like to obtain in permission for their staff members on a month-to-month basis rather than bothering you on a visit-to-visit basis.

Additionally, I would appreciate a general notice being placed on my visitor screen that I am effectively Mr. Amodeo's counsel and should be treated as counsel. By illustration, in the troublesome Alabama interpleader action, I am proceeding on behalf of Mr. Amodeo directly without counsel assistance. (Attached Entry of Appearance).

Finally, for today, could you let me know what I need to do to arrange unmonitored legal calls? Also how to arrange appearance by teleconference. The teleconference or telephonic appearance is the method favored by the primary court's local rules. Plus, in the light of Mr. Amodeo's illness, that medium of appearance is likely to carry the least chance of causing his condition to worsen.
