The birth of 'Cauxé,' a Wixárika term representing the sacred practice of woven offerings to the gods for creative success, marks the genesis of a brand that synthesizes the essence of Wixárika culture (known as Huicholes) with global multiculturalism. With a captivating fusion of heritage and experimentation, Cauxé's fiber-based artwork breathes life into Mexican traditions while embracing an innovative spirit.

Intriguingly, Daniela refined her abilities through meaningful exchanges with master artisans such as Ángela Carrillo from San Andrés Cohamiata, Jalisco; and Miguel Ángel Castillo from Mx City. This foundational experience, built upon her fashion design studies, cultivated a deep understanding of weaving techniques that became the backbone of her creative exploration.

Originally pursued as a hobby, weaving has transformed for the artist into a profound passion, encompassing a wide array of cultural projects. Through these immersive experiences, her artistic perspective has not only blossomed but also fostered a deeper connection to the art of weaving itself.

At the heart of the Cauxé creative process lies the foundation of preliminary sketches, each capturing intricate details that grace her expansive canvases. A harmonious symphony of colors emerges, guided by both deliberate symbolism and intuitive understanding. Within every piece created, layers of threads interweave ingeniously, resulting in a rich saturation that imparts an unparalleled vibrancy and vitality to the work.

Cauxé woven art extends beyond being a mere product; it's a voyage—one that defies confines, transcends norms, and meshes a myriad of styles, disciplines, and cultures. The bold geometry of her compositions pays tribute to the cosmos. It demonstrates mastery over artwork, creating hypnotic and complex structures that hold the viewer captive, inviting exploration of the interconnectedness of patterns through the lens of artistic brilliance.

Daniela's hands are the shuttle, her mind the loom, and the outcome masterpiece stands as a testament to the enduring connection between age-old traditions and the captivating metamorphosis of textiles.


Weaving Cultures


