

## **Niger Uromastyx Care Guide**

#### **Basic Info**

Species: Uromastyx geyri (commonly called Niger or Saharan Uromastyx)

Lifespan: 15-20+ years

Adult Size: 10-14 inches

Temperament: Generally calm, active, and personable with regular interaction

Best for: Intermediate to experienced keepers due to heat and diet needs

### **Enclosure Setup**

Tank Size:

- 40-gallon breeder minimum for juveniles

- Adults require 75-120 gallon enclosures for proper space

- Prefer horizontal floor space over vertical climbing

#### Temperature & Heating:

- Basking spot: 120-130°F

- Cool side: 80-85°F

- Night temps: can safely drop to 65-70°F

- Use a strong basking bulb (halogen or mercury vapor)

#### Lighting:

- UVB is essential (T5 HO ReptiSun 10.0 or Arcadia 12%)

- Provide 12-14 hours of daylight exposure

#### Humidity:

- Maintain low humidity: 10-30%
- Ensure good airflow and avoid misting

#### Substrate:

- Fine sand, excavator clay, or tile
- Provide diggable areas or burrow options

#### Décor & Enrichment:

- Use flat basking rocks, slate ledges, and caves
- Include hides on both warm and cool sides

### **Diet & Feeding**

#### Feeding Frequency:

- Daily for juveniles
- Adults can be fed 5-6 times per week

#### **Primary Foods:**

- Leafy greens: dandelion, collard, mustard, endive, escarole
- Squash, lentils, split peas, flowers (hibiscus, nasturtium)
- NO insects or animal protein strictly herbivorous

#### Supplementation:

- Calcium (without D3): 2-3x/week
- Multivitamin: 1x/week
- Do not oversupplement with D3 rely on proper UVB exposure

#### Water & Hydration:

- Do not mist or soak hydration comes from diet
- A shallow water dish can be offered but is often ignored

# **Handling & Behavior**

#### Handling:

- Uros can be shy at first but often grow calm with handling
- Always support their full body and avoid tail grabbing

#### Behavior to Expect:

- Diurnal and basking-heavy
- May dig, bask for long periods, or retreat to burrows
- Tail-wagging or puffing is defensive behavior

## **Supplies Checklist**

- 40+ gallon enclosure (larger preferred)
- High-output basking bulb & ceramic heat emitter (if needed)
- T5 HO UVB fixture
- Slate tiles or natural sand/clay substrate
- Hides, rocks, and ledges
- Calcium (no D3) and multivitamin powders
- Food dish and daily greens/veggie supply
- Digital thermometers and heat gun
