GOLF NOTICE- PLEASE READ

A brief message from the Superintendent,

At the Annual Membership Meeting, there was a question as to why chipping onto the new Practice Putting Green is prohibited. I will try to address this question better than simply "because I said so!" Even though we are technically past the "grow in period" for the Practice Putting Green, chipping onto the new green risks severe damage to the fragile, and yes still developing turf.

- **Ball Marks and Surface Gouging:** The sandy soil below the new turf is still too soft and cannot withstand the impact of balls hitting the green. These marks are often not visible, but can certainly ruin the smooth surface required for putting.
- **Soil Compaction:** Heavy foot traffic and the impact of balls landing on the soft, new green pack down the delicate soil. This stops water and air from reaching the still shallow and weak roots.
- **Sickness and Disease:** Open scars and torn blades of grass create entry points for fungi and other diseases that spread quickly across the turf.
- **Etiquette and Course Rules:** By prohibiting chipping onto the new practice putting green, we are protecting the club's investment. Most courses require players to use dedicated practice chipping areas. While we do not have this dedicated practice chipping area yet, the hitting net is available as is the old #7 green to chip onto.

So please, Do Not chip onto the new practice putting green. I hope this helps.
