Priority 1: Provide New Park Facilities & Amenities

a. Public Restroom & Concession Combo Building

Current Restroom Issue: In 2020, the public bathroom at Memorial Park was closed and deemed not suitable for use anymore. Due to age, deterioration, and inadequate conditions, the existing building will need to be demolished, sewer/water lines repaired and the structure replaced with a new ADA bathroom facility required to meet all of the current uses at the park. Portable toilets are currently being utilized as a temporary solution, but are not considered an ideal situation.

A well-designed ADA compliant public bathroom is a necessity and the most important amenity at the park. In order to accommodate the numerous sporting events, the annual fair, rodeo, Fourth of July celebration, demolition derby, concerts, and other events that happen throughout the year, it is crucial for us to provide proper ADA facilities to the public.

Concession buildings in combination with a bathroom is a cost-effective way to maximize space and shared utilities. In order to meet heath/sanitation requirements for food handling, a concession stand needs hot/cold water and the proper equipment, which can be accomplished. A Concession Stand is also a great way to earn extra revenue while offering park users with more amenities while accommodating public events, tournaments, and other functions.

Current Concession Issue: In 2011, a grant was secured for a basic level 1 type concession stand. In order to meet the growing usage and health/sanitation requirements, the concession stand needs to be updated and larger to include the proper holding tanks for freshwater and wastewater, and separate sinks for washing, rinsing and sanitizing equipment.

Current concession equipment and offerings include;

 Portable Outdoor BBQ 	- Hot dog machine
- Popcorn machine	- Soda, Water, Candy, Chips
- Snow cone machine	- Beverage Cooler
- Slushi machine	- Freezer (needing replaced)
	- Display Counter

In order to accommodate a Concession Stand that meets food handling requirements and allows us to offer more concession options, the following equipment is required;

- Commercial Refrigerator, Upright Freezer, Ice Maker
- Commercial Wash Basin with 3 sinks, Hand Wash Sink
- Flat Top Grill & Ventilation
- Coffee/Tea Brewer, Carafes
- Fire suppression equipment
- Counter & Storage shelving
- Heat/AC, Hot/Cold Water

Since funding is very limited, grant writing and fundraising will be required to accomplish this goal. Until enough funding can be secured, Memorial Park will not have the proper bathroom facility or Concession Stand to properly accommodate all user groups.

e. New Tennis & Pickleball Courts

Current Issues: The Tennis Courts at Memorial Park are free for the public to use and provide a low-cost recreational opportunity for all ages and abilities. On average, these courts host at least 150 local and visiting players per week.

Pickleball is quickly becoming a popular sport. Since it is not as physically demanding as tennis, it is easier for people of all ages to learn and play. Currently, Pickleball is not available at the Park. In order to advance the sport, adding a pickleball court at the Park is necessary.

The Tennis Courts were built in 1979. Over the past 40 years, these asphalt courts have served the community well, however, due to their age, drainage concerns, and constant exposure to moisture, they are needing to be removed and completely replaced with quality courts meeting competitive play requirements.

Project Plan:

Phase 1:

- Remove mound of dirt, site prep, and utilities (Dependent on funding)
- Add 4 Pickleball Courts (1 Court = 4) (Dependent on funding)

Phase 2:

- Demolish and replace Tennis Courts - 2 Court (Dependent on funding)

Phase 3:

- Add 2 Tennis Courts (4 Tennis Courts Total) (Dependent on funding)
- Add 4 Pickleball Courts (2 Courts = 8 Pickleball) (Dependent on funding)

Priority 2: Improve Parking Lot & Roadway and Pathways

a. New Designated Parking Lot & ADA Sidewalks

Current Issues: The current unpaved gravel roadway to and around Memorial Park is primarily considered one large parking lot. Undefined parking, combined with having no clearly defined roadways through the fairgrounds, leads to people driving and parking vehicles wherever deemed suitable, creating safety hazards, poor traffic flow, congestion, and potential damage to vehicles and property.

The repercussions of undesignated parking and clearly defined roadways include;

- Inefficient use of parking space creating limited parking
- Pedestrian and animal safety concerns
- Conflicts in use for handicapped vehicles, livestock trailers, RVs/campers & public parking
- Poor traffic flow and management, especially during peak season and events.
- Speeding and reckless driving by younger drivers.
- Considerations for designing effective traffic flow and parking arrangements;

Goal 1: Create clearly marked designated parking spaces;

- 1. Concrete blocks/dividers/Timber
- 2. Parking Lot Signage
- 3. Emergency vehicles, RV, Trailer, ADA spaces

Goal 2: Create clearly designated gravel roadway
