BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING

MARCH 11, 2021

THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF EXETER TWP., WYOMING COUNTY HELD THEIR MEETING FOR THE MONTH OF MARCH ON THURSDAY, MARCH 11, 2021 VIA ZOOM. THE MEETING WAS CALLED TO ORDER AT 7:00 PM. IN ATTENDANCE WERE CAROL BARDZEL, RICHARD FITZSIMMONS, DUSTIN ROBINSON, NANCIE HOPKINS, ANDREW HOPKINS, RON JACKSON, ANN MARIE FARLEY, MARK AND HARRY REESE AND DAVE NOCERA. THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE WAS RECEITED. CHAIRMAN, CAROL BARDZEL MADE A MOTION TO ACCEPT THE MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETINGS, SECONDED BY RICHARD FITZSIMMONS. ROAD REPORT DUSTIN REPORTED THAT Hickory Rd. needs some work done on it. The speed bumps by the golf course need to be put back in place by April 1. There was some discussion about permanent ones and we will use the ones we have for right now. There are some drainage issues on Dymond Hollow Rd. and on Coolbaugh Mt. Rd. Andrew has done a good job cutting back the bamboo. There was some discussion concerning the bamboo and the hedges by the Farley property. Dustin reported that there were some ditches and drains that will need to be opened. Andrew reported that a lift will need to be rented to trim some of the low branches in the Township. Richard wants to thank Andrew and Dustin for the jobs they are doing and thank Bill Hopkins for helping out in the snow storm using his equipment. Dave Nocera wants to thank Andrew for his help. Arrangements have been made for Andrew to trim back their roads and they will come up with their chipper and broom to sweep our roads. As a resident he feels the township should buy a new truck, but Carol said we can't justify a new truck right now. Dave said that Andrew did the work in the last snowstorm by himself and Dave had 3 men out to do the job. Andrew

does a great job for the Township. Ann Marie Farley sent a message that the hedges by her house have been there since 1991, and a comment was made that they have grown a lot since they were planted.

BUILDING AND ZONING: RON READ HIS REPORT. THERE WILL BE A ZHB MEETING CONCERNING THE PROPERTY ON RIVER RD FOR SHORT TERM RENTING OR BED AND BREAKFAST on March 24, 2021. Concerning the pavilion Art Coolbaugh wants to put on his property, the planning committee has already feels the zoning can be changed from residential to commercial. The next step would be for Art to submit his new plans for the structure. He has been contacted but we have not received anything as yet.

PARK REPORT the park needs to be cleaned up. The kayak launch needs to be cleaned up after the river goes down and Columbia needs to come back and finish their job. We need to get someone to plant some more trees at the park and put in some concrete pads for benches. There is a resident who needs to do some community service, so we will have him pick up the branches and debris at the park. It was discussed and decided that we will go back to charging \$50.00 to reserve the pavilion and we are not responsible if they do not follow the CDC guidelines. Perhaps we should have a waiver made up.

SENIOR CITIZENS Andrew changed batteries in some of the alarms.

CORRESPONDENCE: assessment changes were received. Liquid fuels money received, the PSATS convention has been cancelled again. Nancie will call Dave Taylor at the Conservation District to see when the next class for dirt roads will be held and Andrew will attend.

Nancie will put the ads in the Citizens Voice. Andrew will train the new person on the equipment, but he is not sure how much past mid April he will be available. He will let the Supervisors know. Concerning a truck, Andrew has been looking. He had been told that some townships lease a plow truck or we could look into hiring a company to do the snowplowing.

NEW BUSINESS a motion was made by Dustin and seconded by Carol to contract for 2 loads of salt through Costars. Roll Call: Carol-yes; Dustin-yes; Richard-yes. Motion carried.
