Ellison's weaving wins award at International Convention



Kristiania member **Nancy Ellison**'s weaving, shown above, won the overall third prize in the Folk Art Exhibition at the International Convention held in August in Bloomington. A spindle, a loom, a dancing girl and two sheep are woven into a design of the Norwegian flag (approx. 18" x 24"). Nancy learned to weave 50 years ago in Norway and is the owner of Ellison Sheep Farm near Zumbrota. She has exhibited and demonstrated at Vesterheim and is a member of several fabric arts groups. NORWEGIAN CLASSES SCHEDULED FOR FALL

Intermediate Language Class (\$100)

Tuesdays, 6:00-7:30 p.m., 8 weeks starting Oct. 2 We will continue with the online NTNU language program (starting at Chapter 7), with more focus on communication verbally. For new experienced or returning students without the book, I am offering the option to have a book with texts and exercises for purchase for \$60. Also available from NTNU for about \$69 plus taxes and shipping.

Introductory Language Classes (2 options) (\$50)

Tuesdays, 7:30-8:30 p.m., 4 weeks starting Oct. 2

Or beginning Tuesday, Oct. 30, 4 weeks

This class will focus on the basics—alphabet, numbers, colors, and basic introductions, as well as conversations about Norwegian culture today. Introductory Language Booklet will be required for this class and will be available at the first class (\$20).

Introduction to Norwegian for Children (\$10 per session)

Saturdays, 10-11 a.m. This class will use fun music and activities to introduce your child to Norwegian. Choose between the following topics and dates:

Her great-grandfather was a member of the Old East Paint Church near Waukon, IA, and his daughter is mentioned in Elisabeth Koren's diary.

From the Social Director

Our program for Oct. 11 is "Norwegian Resistance to Nazi Occupation" by Dr. John Haugo. The Nazis invaded and occupied Norway during World War II from April 1940 to May 1945. The most significant example of resistance was the so-called "Heavy Water War." Telemark saboteurs raided the Vemork Hydro-Electric plant in Rjukan, Telemark, where heavy water (deuterium) was produced. The Germans planned to use the heavy water in their development of an atomic bomb. Dr. John E. Haugo served on the Telelaget of America Board of Directors for twelve years, president for seven. A native of Waubun, MN, he has a BS from MN State-Moorhead, and an MA and PhD from the University of Minnesota. He served as CEO of the MN Education Computing Corporation, Serving Software, Inc., and SearchAmerica Inc. He is currently serving on the Board of Directors of Norway House and on the Board of Trustees of Luther Seminary. He has received numerous awards, including the Outstanding Achievement Award from the U of M this summer. —-Erica Ward, Social Director



Program. Tonight's speaker was Mark DeGarmeaux, a professor at Bethany College in Mankato, MN, and translator of the works of Dr. Ulrik Vilhelm Koren. Pastor Koren became the first Norwegian Lutheran pastor to settle west of the Mississippi River, serving in northeastern lowa and southern Minnesota. Prof. DeGarmeaux chronicled the lives of Pastor Koren and his wife Elisabeth, speaking highly of her diary, which is in our library, as well as of Pastor Koren's impact on the Lutheran religious community in America.
