Scholarship Program—2019

Once again our Lodge will be granting up to six scholarships for graduating high school seniors who plan to further their education by attending a four-year university or college, a two-year junior college, or a vocational school. To be eligible, a student must be graduating from a public high school in Olmsted County—Dover-Eyota, Chatfield, Stewartville, Byron, Century, Mayo, or John Marshall—or be a grandchild or a great-grandchild of a current Lodge member. In addition, the student must complete an application form, which includes six parts, and mail it to our Lodge by March 31, 2019. Applications are then evaluated by our Executive Committee, and the finalists are selected. For students attending a public high school in Olmsted County, the scholarship information will be available in the guidance office of their respective high school. District 1 prefers that the scholarship process be completed by May 17, 2019, but must, at a minimum, be completed before the camper attends camp.



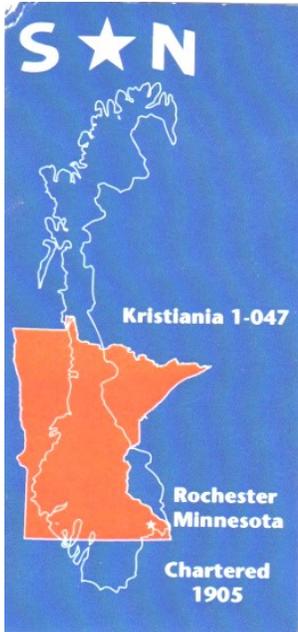
