King's Guard to make appearances in Minnesota



Crossings—200th Anniversary of Norwegian Migration

2025 marks the 200th Anniversary of the first organized emigration of Norwegians to the United States. The single mast sloop, *Restauration*, left Stavanger on July 4, 1825, with 52 people

on board. Often referred to as the "Sloopers," they arrived in New Yok City harbor on October 9, 1825.

The coordinated undertaking for the 200th anniversary has been identified as Crossings, Norway & North America, 1825—2025. The Crossings Bicentennial in North America is managed by a group of dedicated professionals representing the Norwegian American Historical Association, Vesterheim Norwegian-American Museum, Norway House, *The Norwegian American* newspaper, with representation from Sons of Norway and the Sons of Norway Foundation.
