Dr. David Heine presented a program titled "Norsk Frukt— Sett Fra Hardanger " (Norwegian Fruit—A View from Hardanger). David's Norwegian relatives have an apple orchard in the small village of Tokheim, near the town of Odda on the Hardanger Fjord. The fjord stabilizes the local climate, allowing local fruit production; the region accounts for 40% of the fruit grown in Norway. David and his family travel to Tokheim every year to help with the apple harvest, and his talk was filled with historical information, family anecdotes, and semi-technical aspects of fruit agriculture, accented by pictures of the beautiful area surrounding the farm. The stories were delightful and engaging.


