Scholarship Program—2020



Once again our lodge will be granting scholarships to graduating high school seniors who plan to further their education by attending a four-year university or college, a two-year college, or a vocational school. To be eligible,

a student must be graduating from a public high school in Olmsted County-Dover-Eyota, Chatfield, Stewartville, Byron, Century, Mayo, or John Marshall—or be a grandchild or a great-grandchild of a current lodge member. In addition, the student must complete an application form, which includes six parts, and mail it to our lodge by March 31, 2020. Applications are then evaluated by our Executive Committee, and the finalists are selected. For students attending a public high school in Olmsted County, the scholarship information will be available in the guidance office of their respective high school. For all other students, the information may be downloaded from our website—kristiania1-47.org. In either case, the information will be available by February 1st. Scholarship Committee
