***They Glorified Mary...We Glorified Rice*** "A Catholic-Lutheran Lexicon". Short, witty statements ala "They counted on St. Jude for luck...We had wishbones drying on the kitchen window sill."

***Is It Too Windy Back There, Then?*** "A compendium of phrases e heard growing up"

***Uffda, But Those Clip-ons Hurt, Then!*** Adapted drawings of Edvard Munch's famous picture The Scream, with interpretive captions by Norwegian-American-Lutheran farm kids!

***Just how much Scrap Lumber does a man need to save?*** Short essays with photographs on the practice of men's needs for, purchase of, and collections of lumber, along with some short histories of these practices.

***Growing Up Rural "You Smell Barn"*** Short essays and photographs about growing up on a farm and in rural communities. For example: The chapter on clothing is entitled "Put a Slip On, I Can See Right Through You!" and includes Baby Clothes, Church Clothes, Barn Clothes, etc.

***Helga Hanson's Hot Flash Handbook*** "for those who feel like the key on a can of Spam that's gone off track" and includes short essays on maturing such as "A Lullaby for Sleep-Deprived Hotflashing Women" and "When Your Eyes are Fine But Your Arms Are Too Short."

### Rochester Area Keyboard Club—Sons of Norway Piano Competition

On May 18 students who participated in the Sons of Norway Piano Competition and their families joined lodge members for a potluck dinner and then performed their competition pieces in the sanctuary at Our Savior’s Lutheran Church. The students, ages 9-12 or in grades 4-6, competed for either the Scandinavian Composer Prize, given for the best performance of a work by a Scandinavian composer, or the Grand Prize for the overall winner, for which the heritage of the composer was unlimited.

The dinner and performance were well attended. Nine students played in front of an appreciative audience. The Scandinavian Composer Prize was awarded to Junhao Zhang for his performance of Grieg’s Popular Melody Op. 12, No. 5; he was presented with a check for \$50 and a rosemaled plate painted by **Dean Vigeland**. The Grand Prize was given to Hailey Fenner for her rendition of the Sonatina in G, Anh.5, Moderato and Romanze by Beethoven. Hailey also received a rosemaled plate along with a check for \$75.



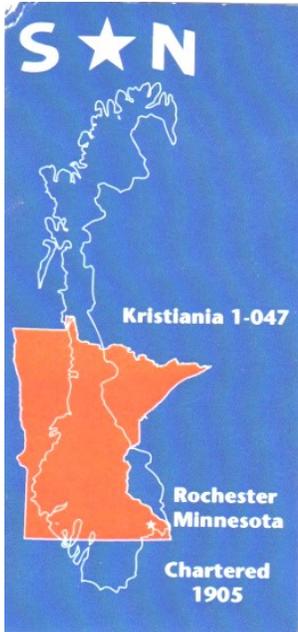
