As the days get longer, as I was reminded a few weeks ago walking out of work (I couldn't help checking my watch to make sure I hadn't left work too early.), the promise of spring is on the horizon.

If you had not already read about the story, I recommend it. The Svalbard Global Seed Vault was opened in 2008 by the Norwegian government, 1,300 kilometers above the Arctic Circle on the Norwegian island, near Longyearbyen, in the remote Arctic Svalbard archipelago. As of 2018, the Svalbard Global Seed Vault holds more than 1 million seed samples from worldwide.

As with many organizations, our lodge flourishes under the support of volunteers. We can always use more help in various areas, from making sandwiches for a Chapter meeting or helping with the room set up to serving as Vice President or Youth Director. Hakon was born in Kristiansand, Norway to missionary parents. When he was 4 months old the family returned to China where he grew up. He and several family members spent 3 years in a Japanese prison camp from 1942 to 1945. In late 1945 the family came to the US. Hakon attended Trinity Bible School and the University of Minnesota. He served three years in the US Army. Following this he was an announcer for WCCO. Then he entered the US diplomatic service and spent time in Laos, Kenya and Washington DC. In the late 80s he became the Executive Director of the Center for International Health at Case Western Reserve University in Cleveland. He retired in 1993 and has been organic farming near Kenyon, Minnesota, since then. He was a co-founder of Minnesota International Health Volunteers (now Wellshare) and of Health Frontiers. He is a member of the Kenyon American Legion, Kenyon Color Guard, and Kenyon Sons of Norway. Come for supper and stay to hear Hakon's story.

**Saturday, March 28 6 pm. Ethnic Dinner** featuring the sounds of a Chinese *Erhu*. ### Scholarship Program—2020



Once again our lodge will be granting scholarships to graduating high school seniors who plan to further their education by attending a four-year university or college, a two-year college, or a vocational school. To be eligible, a student must be graduating from a public high school in Olmsted County—Dover-Eyota, Chatfield, Stewartville, Byron, Century, Mayo, or John Marshall—or be a child, a grandchild, or a great-grandchild of a current lodge member. In addition, the student must complete an application form, which includes six parts, and mail it to our lodge by March 31, 2020. Applications are then evaluated by our Executive Committee, and the finalists are selected. For students attending a public high school in Olmsted County, the scholarship information will be available in the guidance office of their respective high school. 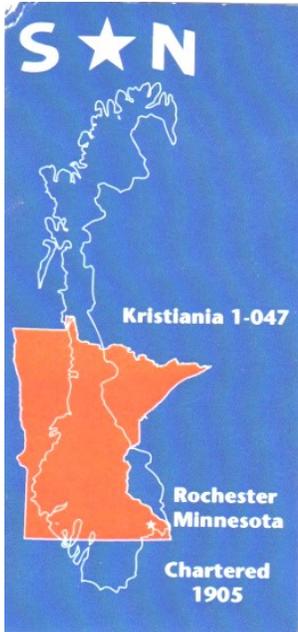
