The stamps are sold (to collectors), and the profits are used to help children and youth with disabilities, and children and youth with handicaps, in Norway and to finance the efforts to eradicate tuberculosis.

Setesdal Named to UNESCO Intangible Heritage List

After a seven-year campaign, the folk music and dance traditions from Setesdal in Agder County (southern Norway) have been added to the UNESCO list of Intangible Cultural Heritage. UNESCO (the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization) regards intangible cultural heritage as the traditions passed between ancestors and descendants. A few examples are traditional storytelling, performing arts, rituals, festivals and craft skills.

In a practice woven into Setesdal life since the 1700s, the singing of stev (four-line a cappella storytelling songs) is interspersed with tunes played on a Hardingfele (Hardanger fiddle) or munnharpe (mouth harp) to accompany a traditional couple's dance, gangar. Stev are meant to be shared in social settings and are typically learned through family members or local musicians. The gangar fiddle tunes are marked with loud, rhythmic foot paddling. International recognition of these cultural expressions not only promotes preservation, but also increases tourism. The rugged and remote valley of Setesdal may soon receive new visitors, as recordings of this art form can never compare to the transporting experience of live performance.


Coronavirus in Norway and Sweden

The first reported case of Coronavirus in Norway was in Tromsø, 2/26/20, which was quickly quarantined. Then Oslo had the next outbreak. The hardest hit areas are Oslo and the surrounding Viken county, but all counties have had more than 100 cases. On 3/12/20 Norway invoked emergency powers to stop the spread of the virus, which was extended until 4/12/20, on Easter. The krone, the stock market, and businesses have suffered. The Hurtigruten suspended service for one month. Following Easter, Norway's Minister of Health and Care announced a relaxed Coronavirus restriction, but the event ban continues until June 15. Schools and businesses were allowed to reopen 4/20/20, and the cabin restriction was lifted. There are strict penalties for violation of quarantines. Air travel is restricted, and border closures are still in place. Prime Minister Erna Solberg says "the contagion curve has flattened out, emergency measures have worked, but we can't let down our guard..." Testing, better detection, and rapid isolation is said to be important in the next phase to reopen society. As of 4/22/20 Norway has had 7,241 coronavirus cases with 182 deaths. Norway attributes their lower death rate to their high quality health care and emergency measures that were put in place. "Sweden has nearly 10 times the number of Covid-19 related deaths than its Nordic neighbors." Even though Sweden's population is larger, their lack of lockdowns other than a ban on gathering of 50 or more has caused the disease to be widespread. Sweden has had 15,322 Covid-19 cases and 1,765 deaths. Finland has had 4,014 cases and 141 deaths.

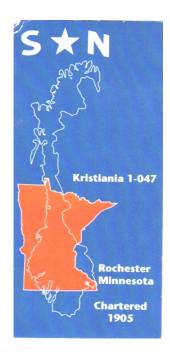

We're 115 years old! Long-time Kristiania members will remember the former meeting place, the Stone Corner School, once located along US 52. This picture is from "A History of District 1 Sons of Norway Centennial Edition 1895-1995." The article about Kristiania notes that the lodge was chartered on May 30, 1905, but activities ceased in 1919. The lodge was reactivated in 1934.
