
HILSEN FRA PRESIDENTEN

UKRAINIAN REFUGEES IN NORWAY

Norway could accept 60,000 Ukrainian refugees this year, the country's Directorate of Immigration (UDI) said while presenting scenarios for the arrival of Ukrainian refugees on Wednesday."We must take into account that the flow of refugees can last a long time, and the government has therefore asked the police to establish a new registration centre at Gardermoen", said justice and emergency management minister Emilie Enger Mehl in a press release.

The UDI presented a low scenario, a middle scenario and a high scenario in its <u>last report</u>. The UDI now recommends that the authorities plan for 60,000, which is the estimate presented in the middle scenario. "Which of the scenarios will be most realistic is very difficult to assess. For planning purposes, however, we would recommend using the middle scenario with 60,000 as a point estimate", the UDI states in the report.

Hostilities will continue throughout the summer in this scenario, with some seven million refugees fleeing Ukraine in 2022. In the middle to long term, countries bordering Ukraine will have difficulty dealing with the number of refugees.

Many refugees could give up hope of returning to their homes in 2022 and seek refuge in neighbouring countries and other European countries. Norway is considered a country with good welfare schemes and a reasonable labour market, meaning the country might eventually have to welcome a more significant number of refugees than expected.

In this scenario, Norway, a country with five million inhabitants, would receive 60,000 refugees, between 0.7% to 1% of those who fled Ukraine.In its forecasts, the UDI assumes a settlement need of 35,000 refugees in 2022.
