Twin Cities Hardingfelelag (Hardanger Fiddle Group) is dedicated to the performance of traditional hardanger fiddle music. The group provides dance music at Scandinavian events around the Twin Cities and in outstate MN. The hardanger fiddle, the national folk instrument of Norway, is ornately decorated with pen and ink designs called *rosing* and inlaid mother-of-pearl. It's like a violin, but has an additional four or five sympathetic strings that run underneath the fingerboard. These add a unique droning sound when the top primary strings are bowed. The members of the group wear bunads, Norwegian folk costume, with each *bunad* coming from a particular area of Norway.

I will be collecting used stamps again for TUB-FRIM. There is a container that we will set out at our regular meetings for you to deposit




them in. Remember to leave ¼--½ inch of space around all sides of each stamp. They will be brought to our next District One convention and then sent to Norway to benefit the disabled.
