"Viktoria Borgessen"

An evening of comedy and music will be presented at our November 14 meeting. A woman calling herself Viktoria Borgessen will entertain with her *nyckelharpa*, a traditional Swedish instrument. While playing Scandinavian folk tunes and relating the history and mechanics of the *nyckelharpa*, she will occasionally lapse into stories and jokes. Any similarity to the late Danish performer, Victor Borge, is purely intentional.

Viktoria, aka Marilyn McGriff, is a local historian and performer now living in Minneapolis. Formerly from the Cambridge, MN, area, she documented numerous facets of Swedish immigration, including the story of a Swedish-American settlement in Cuba in the early days of the 20th century While living in Cambridge, she also organized an east central Minnesota *spelmanslag* called the Spirit River Scandiband.

Marilyn plays regularly with the Twin Cities Nyckeharpalag. Her participation in musical groups, her presentation of Viktoria, and her illustrated talks on topics of Swedish immigration are efforts to both celebrate Scandinavian heritage and maintain folk music traditions. You'll listen, learn and laugh at Marilyn's persona as Viktoria with her *nyckelharpa*.

From one of our *Unge Venner*, Dahlia Ward

Hi, I am Dahlia and have been a member of the Kristiania lodge since we moved to Rochester. As I member, I have enjoyed the lodge events and lodge support to attend the Norwegian language camp, Masse Moro. I am also a cadette in Girl Scouts, and with my troop have enjoyed helping set up, serve, and clean up at our lodge's special events.



This year I started my Girl Scout silver project to earn my Silver Award. This award is focused on Girl Scouts learning how to provide active leadership and management on a project that provides an outcome that benefits a group within the community or the whole community. My partner and I decided to hold an event for the children living in a neighborhood without access to a safe space to play, like a playground. We partnered with Rochester Parks and Rec, RPS American Indian liaison, Hy-Vee, and an anonymous donor to provide the following: mobile playground, games, popsicles, and school supplies. The location we chose was a trailer park with the majority of the kids attending Jefferson, Kellogg, and Century.

The event was a lot of fun, and we had many games and participants, more than 30 people. We handed out lots of school supplies to kids who needed them and played games with them. We also learned that despite the kids attending Rochester schools, generally, they are not eligible to receive services from Rochester community programs. We discovered this fact when we were unable to get the Rochester Police Department's Cops and Kids program to attend the event. The reason given was that the trailer park was located just outside the city boundary. It is patrolled by the County Sheriff's Department, and unfortunately the county does not provide a program like the Cops and Kids, which focuses on bike safety for kids.


Overall, my partner and I learned about differences and access for families and children based on a geographic location even though the locations belong to the same community. We also learned active leadership and project management, building relationships between the community, people, and community resources.
