October 12 Program: Stave Churches of Norway

Stave churches were once common in Scandinavia and northern Europe. In Norway alone, it was thought that about 1000 were built, although recent research suggests there may have been closer to 2000. Now there are only about 28 still standing in Norway. Our presenter **Rose Marie Meuwissen** is fascinated with stave churches and has traveled to Norway many times to visit and explore them. Rose Marie is going to share photos and teach us about them. She lives in the Minneapolis area and is the author of the "Real Norwegians" series of Norwegian children's books with English and Norwegian text. Her website is : www.realnorwegianseatlutefisk.com

Rustad and *Remedies and Rituals: Folk Medicine in Norway and the New Land* by Kathleen Stokker. It was an interesting insight into the tensions between the needs of the rural population and the hierarchy of the church and local government.
