Born in 1954 to a Swedish-American family in Minneapolis, **Paul Dahlin** began playing the fiddle at the age of nine. Learning from his grandfather, Edwin, who came to the US from Dalarna, Sweden, in 1924, and from his mother and uncle, Paul was soon performing at Swedish-American events in the Upper Midwest. Paul took the lead in their group known as the <u>American Swedish Spelmans Trio</u> with his grandfather and his uncle, and he continues to entertain today. In 1996, he was recognized as a National Heritage Fellow by the National Endowment for the Arts because of his work with traditional Swedish music. This is sure to be another outstanding musical program!

In early September, a new exhibition was installed at Oslo's Gardermoen Airport. This display consists of seven Viking Age swords that have been unearthed in various places in Norway. 


**Pop Tabs**—-save your pop can tabs!


