SUBJECT: Report of SPNO Annual Meeting

The first Annual Meeting of the Sunrise Park Neighborhood Organization ("SPNO") was held on Saturday, March 21, 2015 at the Mizell Center located at 480 S. Sunrise Way (at Ramon Road). In addition to the list of property addresses represented at the meeting, attached hereto are copies of the Meeting Agenda, Summary of Proposed Bylaws Changes, twelve-page Power Point Presentation displayed during the meeting and two-page Nextdoor Flyer distributed to attendees.

A total of 28 households "checked in" at the registration desk and received ballots for the planned election of the new Board of Advisors during the meeting. Several properties were represented by more than one attendee (although votes taken during the meeting were restricted to one per property).

Following a general welcome by Chairperson Curt Watts and introduction of the current members of the Board of Advisors, the following topics were discussed (followed by actions as indicated below):

- 1) Vice Chairperson Kathy Cohn reviewed the 2014 neighborhood priorities which helped guide the Board's activities during the last year.
- 2) Last year's accomplishments of the Board and Organization were reviewed by individual Board Members Roseann Bleiweiss, Kathy Cohn, Byron Lohman & Curt Watts. They included:
 - Official establishment of the organization per City procedures, election of the first seven-member Board of Advisors and addition of two representatives as provided in the Bylaws from properties located south of Tahquitz.
 - Fundraising activities this past year including contributions from individual members, the film screening of "Mona Lisa is Missing" at the local Camelot Theatres and a Modernism Week 2015 Home Tour.
 - Ongoing communications with the neighborhood which were extensive and utilized Nextdoor, Facebook, our e-mail contact list of Members and our website www.SunriseParkPS.com.

- The approval and funding of neighborhood identification blade signs which resulted in nineteen (19) installations around the perimeter of the neighborhood.
- Meetings with Police Department representatives regarding neighborhood crime issues and initial discussions toward establishing a Neighborhood Watch program.
- Participation in the City's Festival of Lights Parade and plans to have a booth for SPNO at the upcoming annual PSNIC Picnic.
- Input to the City on several issues impacting the neighborhood including bike routes, planned repaying of City streets and policies affecting vacation rental properties.
- 3) Board Member Bruce Maughan introduced several amendments to the current SPNO Bylaws proposed by the Board of Advisors including the establishment of "staggered terms" for future Board members, clarification of officer duties and further definition of the difference between "Eligible Members" and "Members". (The proposed bylaw amendments were reviewed with City staff prior to the Annual Meeting and after their description to meeting attendees the proposed amendments were adopted unanimously at the Annual Meeting by a show of hands of all in attendance limited to one vote per property/household).
- 4) Chairperson Curt Watts outlined the procedure for electing the next Board of Advisors, to serve until the next Annual Meeting in March 2016. The seven individuals who "prenominated" themselves in advance of today's meeting were introduced and one additional nomination was received from the floor. The eight nominees were:
 - Roseann Bleiweiss
 - Kathy Cohn
 - William Follett
 - Byron Lohman
 - Bruce Maughan
 - Carolyn Mayfield (nominated from the floor)
 - Mike Scebbi
 - Curt Watts

Following brief statements from each nominee, ballots were completed and then collected by those responsible for tallying the votes (with results to be announced later in the meeting).

5) Vice Chairperson Kathy Cohn acknowledged meeting attendee Lee Bonno representing the City's Office of Neighborhood Involvement. Kathy then described progress on establishment of a Neigborhood Watch program for the Sunrise Park Neighborhood. She also introduced Lt. Gus Araiza of the City's Police Department for comments and Q&A from attendees. Two additional representatives from the Police Department were also in attendance and participated in this portion of the meeting.

- 6) Chairperson Curt Watts reviewed the Survey Form distributed to everyone for input regarding neighborhood priorities for next year. A total of 23 survey forms were submitted and the results tabulated after the meeting. (A summary of the results is attached hereto along with a comparison to last year's input).
- 7) Based upon the report from the individuals tallying the 23 submitted election ballots, Chairperson Curt Watts announced that the seven (7) members elected to the Board of Advisors for next year would be:

 - Byron Lohman
 - Bruce Maughan
 - Carolyn Mayfield
 - Curt Watts
- 8) Closing Announcements included the March 28th PSNIC/ONE-PS Picnic to be held at Ruth Hardy Park and the April 18th Meeting of the newly-elected Board of Advisors.

Summary of Proposed Bylaws Changes - SPNO

Definition of "Eligible Member":

- The term "Eligible Members" will be defined to include "property owners, residents and business occupants" within the boundaries of Sunrise Park.
- This is the definition prescribed by the City's ordinance governing neighborhood organizations; previously, "business occupants" were inadvertently omitted.
- The defined term "Eligible Member(s)" will be used consistently throughout the Bylaws.

Definition of "Member":

- A "Member" will be defined as an Eligible Member who has given his or her contact information to the Communications Officer in order to receive updates and regular communications from the organization (beyond the Annual Meeting Notice).
- Both Eligible Members and Members are allowed to vote under the terms of the Bylaws.

Staggered Terms for Board of Advisors:

- The existing Bylaws call for the Board of Advisors to be comprised of seven members serving one-year terms. The current Board believes it is advisable to stagger the terms of Board members to prevent a situation where a Board comprised of all new members would have no prior institutional knowledge of the prior Board's actions and policies.
- To accomplish the goal of staggered terms, the Board is recommending that the top four votegetters in the 2015 Board election be elected to two-year terms and the next three top votegetters be elected to one-year terms.
- After the 2015 election, all Board members would be elected to two-year terms with three Board members elected in even-numbered years, and four Board members elected in oddnumbered years.

Officers' Duties:

- The proposed amendment clarifies that expenditure approvals in excess of \$100 are to be approved by the Board (and not just the Officers of the Board – i.e. Chair, Vice Chair, etc.).
- The Secretary will no longer be responsible for official correspondence of the organization.
 In practice during the past year, each Officer and Board member has written correspondence consistent with his or her duties.
- As directed by the Board, the Communications Officer will be specifically authorized to conduct
 electronic polling to collect opinions from the membership on certain issues that come before
 the Board (for instance, blade sign design choices).
