Minutes of September 11, 2018

<u>Call To Order</u> -- The regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Fire Commissioners was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by Chairman Spohn, following proof of publication in accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Annual Meeting Notice was published in the official newspaper of the district and provided to two other newspapers, filed with the municipal clerk, posted at the municipal building, the Board's office and on the fire district website, and provided to any person requesting same in advance of the meeting.

<u>Roll Call</u> -- Upon Roll Call the following Commissioners were present: W. Spohn, T. Karsay, J. Kessler, M. Parise, W. Hyncik. Absent: None. Also present: Chief Huxley, Deputy Chief Schroeck, Engineer Fedun, L. Franchino and Attorney Griswold.

<u>Moment of Silence</u> – Those present joined hands as sign of unity, strength, and American resolve and observed a moment of silence to remember those who lost their lives, particularly emergency responders, in the September 11, 2001 terrorist attacks.

<u>Approval of Minutes</u> – The Board reviewed the minutes of the August 14, 2018 regular meeting. A motion was made to approve the minutes of the August 14, 2018 board meeting as presented.

Motion made by Hyncik. 2nd by Karsay. Motion passed without objection.

<u>MEMS Presentation</u> — Captain Johanna Snedeker presented a request that the district purchase an ice machine for use at MEMS' station to allow them to fill and store bags of ice on site for use at emergency calls. At this time they fill bags off-site and store in a freezer at the station. She presented competitive quotes for a machine suitable for their purposes and thanked the board for its consideration and generous support of MEMS.

A motion was made to approve the purchase of an ice machine for use by Montgomery Township Emergency Medical Service.

Motion made by Spohn. 2^{nd} by Hyncik. Motion passed without objection.

RESOLUTION 2018-35 – Purchase of Equipment for use by MEMS

The Chief Financial Officer having certified there are sufficient unencumbered funds in the 2018 budget, authorization to purchase for use by Montgomery Township Emergency Medical Service one (1) Monitowoc under counter ice cube machine (90-100# capacity), pursuant to lowest quote submitted from Ice Machines Plus, or vendor with similar cost, at a cost of \$1,912.00, plus shipping - the total expenditure not to exceed \$2,300.00, chargeable to the 2018 EMS equipment appropriation.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Cmsr. Hyncik negotiated a significant reduction in monthly waste management costs with the vendor and was able to secure an increase in the interest rate applicable to the PNC Bank investment account. PNC is interested in meeting with the board to discuss investment vehicles that may be of interest.

A motion was made to transfer \$300,000.00 from the PNC Bank operating account to the PNC Bank investment account.

A motion was made to approve a contract with Republic Services for waste removal and recycling.

RESOLUTION 2018-36 - Approving Waste Removal Contract

The Chief Financial Officer having certified there are sufficient unencumbered funds in the operating budget, approval of Cmsr. Hyncik's execution of a contract on behalf of the board with Republic Services for waste removal services and recycling fees at a combined cost of \$117.37 per month, chargeable to the Utilities appropriation in the applicable year's budget and subject to the availability and appropriation annually of sufficient funds to meet the obligations.

Monthly Bills/Financial Statement Review -- A copy of the Treasurer's report was made available to each Commissioner with a list and description of the bills to be paid. Six invoices were added to the list of bills to be paid: Verizon (\$92.67), chargeable to the 2018 Utilities appropriation; Solitario & Tierney (\$9,000.00) for the 2017 financial audit, chargeable to the 2018 Professional Services appropriation; MTVFC#1 Chief's account (\$500.00) reimbursement for training costs, chargeable to the 2018 Training appropriation; Wireless Communication (\$560.00) for a portable radio repair and Harlingen Garage (\$12.58) for 45-154 oil & fluids, both chargeable to the 2018 Repair and Maintenance appropriation; and Harlingen Garage (\$41.69) for a step light, chargeable to the 2018 General Operating appropriation.

<u>RESOLUTION 2018-37 – Payment of Bills</u>

The Chief Financial Officer having certified there are sufficient encumbered and unencumbered funds in the 2018 budget to pay the bills as presented and supplemented, and having designated the accounts to which each should be charged, a Resolution passed authorizing payment of the bills in the total amount of \$31,274.39.

RESOLUTION 2018-38 – Review of 2017 Fire District Annual Financial Audit. (Attached)

<u>Insurance</u> – Commissioners Spohn and Parise met with the insurance broker. The broker will provide competitive quotes for policy renewals. The 2017 workers' comp audit has been completed and the roster has been updated. Where applicable, beneficiary designation forms are being distributed to members in connection

with the Accident & Sickness Policy. Vehicle and Property coverage is adequate as is; increasing property deductibles will be discussed.

<u>Boat</u> – Deputy Chief Schroeck presented a summary of the fire company's review of inflatable boats suitable for swiftwater rescue situations that arise in this and neighboring fire districts. The boat will replace the 20-year old inflatable that has outlived its useful life. Funding for the purchase was generously donated by the Rotary Club of Montgomery/Rocky Hill. Research into options for securing a trailer is still underway.

RESOLUTION 2018-39 - Purchase of Inflatable Boat and Motor

The Chief Financial Officer having certified there are sufficient funds available from a donation received for this purpose, pursuant to lowest quote received from Mid-Atlantic Rescue Systems, Inc., authorization to purchase one R ONE Series 6-person inflatable rescue boat at a cost of \$3,274.00, and one (1) Mercury 30 hp motor and prop guard at a cost of \$5,253.95, with installation, rigging, testing and shipping costs of \$1,000.00; the total cost chargeable to the donation not to exceed \$9,527.95 for this purchase.

WHEREAS, failure to comply with the regulation of the local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey may subject the members of the local governing body to the penalty provisions of R.S. 52:27BB-52, to wit:

R.S. 52:27BB-52: A local officer or member of a local governing body who, after a date fixed for compliance, fails or refuses to obey an order of the director (Director of Local Government Services), under the provisions of this Article, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, may be fined not more than one thousand dollars (\$1000.00) or imprisoned for not more than one year, or both, and in addition shall forfeit his office.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, that the governing body of Montgomery Township Fire District No. 1 certifies to the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey that each governing body member has personally reviewed the Annual Audit Report for the fiscal year ended December 31, 2017, and specifically has reviewed the sections of the audit report entitled "General Comments" and "Recommendations", and has evidenced same by group affidavit in the form prescribed by the Local Finance Board; and
