

Texas Joins Forces with Over 8,000 Special Districts Nationwide – *National Special Districts Association confirms Texas Special Districts Coalition as newest member*

April 30, 2025 | Washington D.C. – Texas has officially become the 11th state with confirmed membership in the *National Special Districts Association (NSDA)*—the largest nationwide organization strengthening essential community services and promoting the idea that “Special Districts Make the Difference”. *NSDA* has accepted the *Texas Special Districts Coalition (TSDC)* as the most recent state-wide association to join forces with the growing network of special districts across the country to promote innovate, collaborate, and advocate to ensure that special districts remain a vital part of national and local communities.

NSDA provides its nationwide members with a wide array of resources including federal advocacy news & updates, trends in special district governance, training and a webinar library on a variety of topics from professional experts, and direct consulting services on grants and federal funding opportunities. Now all *TSDC* members/participants in Texas may enjoy access to these same benefits as the thousands of special districts in other states who are already *NSDA* members.

While 11 states maintain some level of membership in *NSDA*, *Texas has actually become the 8th state with ‘executive-level’ membership in NSDA* (e.g., voting rights and executive leadership opportunities) due to the partnership between *TSDC* and *NSDA*. Accordingly, *TSDC* is now the pipeline through which *all* Texas special districts can access the resources and benefits *NSDA* offers. This partnership is also providing Texas special districts the opportunity to meet with U.S. Congressional representatives in the House and Senate, both in Washington D.C. and here in our home state in their local district offices.
